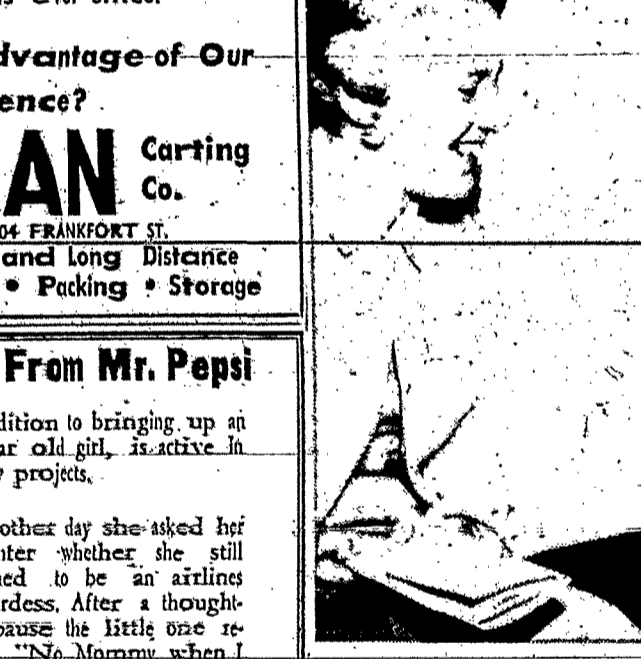
This meeting will be the last opportunity to purchase "The Council Cooks." The business meeting will be closed following the election of officers.
