

Bishop Kearney To Confer 58 Lay Catechist Awards

Bishop James E. Kearney will award CCD Lay Catechist Teaching certificates to 58 men and women of the Diocese at a joint meeting to be held on Monday evening, May 25 at the Assumption School of Religion, Fairport.

The catechists successfully completed a sixty hour course in Elementary and High School Methods of Teaching Religion taught by the Sisters, Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart and Christian Doctrine, taught by Rev. Richard A. Hart of the Geneva area, Rev. William Gaylor of the Clifton Springs area and Reverend Edward A. Zimmer, Otto J. Vogt and William M. Thomas of the Ithaca parish.

CATECHISTS REPRESENT 33 parishes of the Rochester diocese. The classes were composed of men and women from all walks of life including busy housewives, office workers, teachers, nurses, social workers, business executives, college students and many others.

Groups of Mother's Circles in St. Rita's parish, West Webster cooperated to make it possible for 6 of its members to attend the Teacher's course. St. Stephen's, Geneva and St. Felix's, Clifton Springs, were represented by 5 members each in the class.

NAZARETH College students will also receive diplomas. Many of these catechists are already assisting their pastors in the teaching of Religion to public school children in the parish.

Fifty-two men and women will also be rewarded for their contribution of Christian Doctrine pins for the various CCD courses which they took, as Discussion Club leaders, Parent Educators or Helpers. Ten members of Assumption Parish, Fairport, 10 from St. Joseph's, Penfield, 6 from St. Mary of the Lake, Ontario, and others from St. Paul of the Cross, Elmoreville; Holy Trinity, Webster; St. Patrick's, Macedon; St. Boniface and Immaculate Conception will receive pins for Discussion Club training.

The 10 Helpers and 7 Parent-Educator Visitors to receive pins are all members of the Assumption Parish, Fairport where the training courses were offered by the Sisters, under the direction of pastor, Rev. Leonard A. Kelly.

THE PROGRAM for the evening will include: musical selections by harpist, Miss Mary Brigid Callan, and a solo by Courtney Crane. Graduates will be presented by Rev. Albert H. Schnacky, Diocesan Director of the CCD. Certificates and CCD emblem pins will be conferred by Bishop Kearney. CCD Leaders will be presented by Rev. Leonard A. Kelly, pastor of Assumption. Followed by a sermon by the Bishop, Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be given by Rt. Rev. Msgr. William Byrne, pastor of Immaculate Conception Church, Ithaca. Pastors of the various parishes will also attend.
