St. Andrew's Seminary will graduate thirty-two seniors at commencement exercises to be held in the seminary auditorium Thursday, June 4, at 3 p.m.

### St. Bernard's Graduates 36

Fourteen young men will be ordained to the holy priesthood in separate ceremonies, one in Rochester, the other in Auburn, Friday and Saturday, June 5 and 6.

Bishop Kearney will ordain ten at Sacred Heart Cathedral Friday morning. Auxiliary Bishop Casey will ordain four at Holy Family Church, Auburn, on Saturday morning.

The cathedral ceremony is scheduled to begin at 10 a.m., the Auburn rite at 9 a.m.

The Friday ordination rite also marks the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, patron of the Cathedral and the Rochester Diocese.

Besides the fourteen to be ordained for the Diocese of Rochester, an additional 21 members of St. Bernard's Seminary 1959 ordination class will serve in the Hartford archdiocese and five other dioceses.

All of the new priests of the Rochester Diocese will celebrate their first solemn Masses in their respective parish churches Sunday, June 7.

### Prayer Day For Peace

Washington — (NC) — President Eisenhower has designated Memorial Day, May 30, as a day of national prayer for permanent peace.

He proposed a 11 a.m. to 12 p.m. prayer in each locality as the time to unite in prayer. He asked all Americans to pray for the nation's war dead and also to pray for strength to go forward toward a world of peace, justice and honor.

"Since we must seek to know, to accept and to accomplish the will of Almighty God," the President said in his proclamation, "and since we believe it to be His will that peace on earth shall come day prevail, it is fitting that we pray for Divine help in building a world in which families of men may prosper together in justice and in honor."

### Africa Drums At London Mass

London — (RNS) — African drums will be beaten at the elevation during a high Mass in St. Ethelreda's Roman Catholic church here on Sunday, May 31, when the priest, deacon and subdeacon will all be East Africans.

The Mass, to be offered on the Day of National Prayer for Africa, will be the monthly one for Catholic professors and students of London University. A choir of White Fathers, whose order does extensive missionary work in Africa, will sing at the Mass.

### Auxiliary Named To N.Y.

New York — (NC) — Monsignor John J. Maguire, vicar general of the New York archdiocese, has been named titular bishop of Antiphra and auxiliary to Cardinal Spellman.

The fifty-five year old prelate was ordained in Rome in 1928 and raised to the rank of a monsignor in 1948.

Rome — (RNS) — Pope John XXIII, who has shown a keen interest in sports, may personally assist at religious rites scheduled in connection with the 1960 Olympic Games to be held in Rome, according to Vatican authorities.
