Saturday at Rochester I was part of a gathering which gave this aim a very special place. The women of the Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women met for their annual tea honoring Bishop Kearney. This was held in the lounge of the beautiful Medaille Hall of Nazareth College.

IN THE LARGE number who attended in spite of the heavy rain and of the considerable distances traversed, one might read a reminder of the love and devotion which the women of the diocese feel toward their Bishop.

In a sense the gathering underlined the fact that by their working in the Diocesan Council, a part of the National Council of Catholic Women, which is organized to direct the Catholic Action of lay women into channels indicated by the Bishops of the United States, these women have signified their intention of giving proof of their loyalty to their Bishop.

Bishop Kearney spoke to the women and told us of his recent audience with Pope John. Not only did he mention the lovable human qualities which have endeared Our Holy Father to all who know him, but Bishop

heard that in the presence of Pope John, the greatest man in Christendom, one is reminded of the passage, "Unless you become as little children, you will not enter into the kingdom of heaven."

The afternoon passed quickly and delightfully as we exchanged greetings, renewed old friendships, garnered ideas for future projects. Then it was time for our guest of honor to leave. Before departing Bishop Kearney gave us the blessing of Pope John.

It was a memorable afternoon and one which, I am certain, made each woman present want to go back to her own parish organization and be a better, more dedicated member of that group.

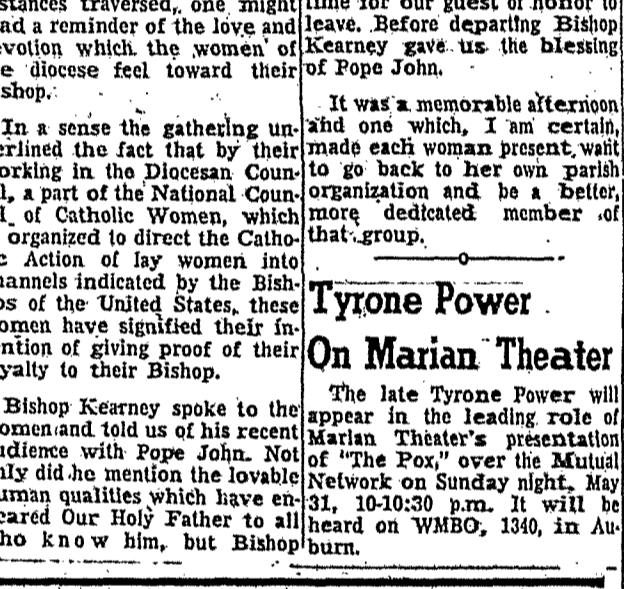
Senior Class of Nazareth College will hold their annual picnic at Willow Pond Park Wednesday, June 3, from 9 until 3.
