## KC Chaplain Explains Pope's Ruling On Reds

CORNING — A first hand report on Pope John's latest ruling on Communism was received by members of Corning Council, Knights of Columbus, in a talk last week presented by the Rev. Simone Heine, S.A., chaplain.

Explaining the ruling prohibiting support of Communism or communistic leanings, the Rev. Heine said it was known that membership in the communistic party is cause of excommunication from the Roman Catholic Church.

THE NEW RULING, according to Father Heine, makes a grievous sin to support by vote or otherwise any plans or policies of the communists. He said that Communism is both a movement of social protest and conspiracy toward world conquest.

As a form of social protest, the chaplain said, Communism appeals to the underprivileged and underprivileged in capitalistic and democratic forms on government, promising a better and happier life in a society of equality and justice.

This particular threat is being made to lay in the Asiatic and African world, the Rev. Heine added. However, the people simply become pawns, he said, Hungary, Poland and East Germany are proof.

"AS A CONSPIRACY, Communism poses a double threat to us of the non-communist world that of military aggression and of subversion, or indirect aggression," the K. of C. chaplain said.

He pointed out that the Roman Catholic Church opposes Communism in every way through its teaching of social justice, thereby offering the underprivileged an alternate choice to the treacherous offers of Communism.
