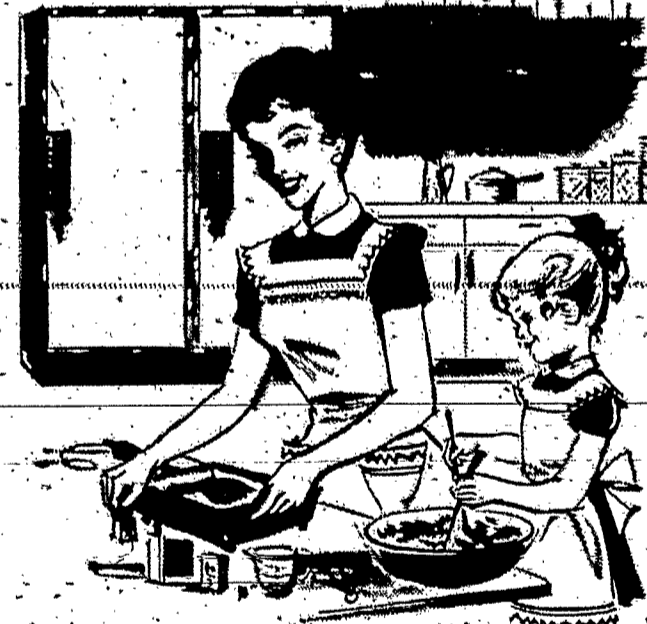

Father Megivern Says First Mass

Owego — "A young man does not choose the priesthood. The priesthood, through a call from God, chooses the young man." These were words used in the sermon delivered at the First Solemn High Mass of Rev. James J. Megivern, C.M., at St. Patrick's Church, Sunday, May 31.

The sermon was given by the Rev. William J. Gromley, C.M., of the Catholic University at Washington.
