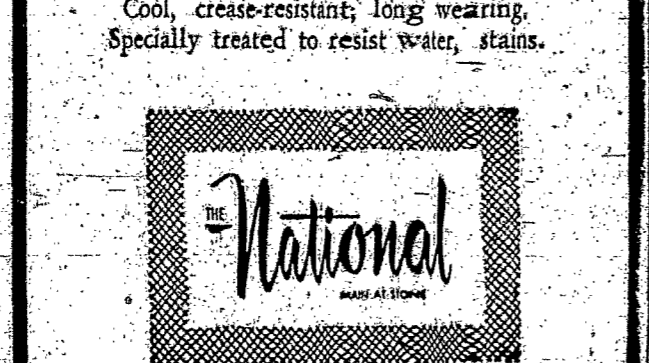

Joyce, an above-average student who has served ably on the Student Council for the past three years has been elected during this past week by student vote to the office of Council President for the coming year.

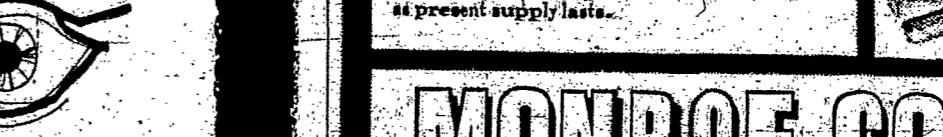
