

Orthodox Priest Embraces Faith

Detroit—(NC)—After 45 years in the Rumanian Orthodox Church, Father Peter Moga, a validly ordained priest, will be received formally into the Roman Catholic Church on June 14, at St. Mary's church in nearby Dearborn.

Archbishop John F. Dearden of Detroit, has approved the sign and the delegation of the Bishop John A. Donovan of Detroit to preside at the ceremonies.

Born in the U.S. but raised in Rumania, Father Moga was ordained in the Orthodox Church at Grass Lake, Mich., July 2, 1938.

FOR SEVEN years he worked with an Orthodox congregation in St. Paul, Minn., and in 1945 came to Dearborn where he was pastor of St. Peter and Paul Orthodox church.

During Easter Week, 1956, Father Moga petitioned the late Cardinal Edward Mooney, Archbishop of Detroit, for entrance into the Catholic Church.

The Cardinal delegated Bishop Donovan, then Chancellor of the archdiocese, to review the circumstances of the case. The validity of Father Moga's orders was referred to Rome. The Sacred Congregation of the Oriental Church in collaboration with the Holy Office, after careful investigation, declared that Father Moga had been validly ordained.

A professor at Sacred Heart seminary reviewed moral theology with Father Moga and then Father Lyman Fenn, S.S., rector of St. John's provincial seminary, examined him in preparation for faculties to preach and administer the sacraments.

Father Moga will serve as assistant at St. Mary's Rumanian Catholic Church in Dearborn. As is customary among some priests of the Eastern Rite and among most in the Orthodox

Church, Father Moga is married. He and his wife, Valetie, live in Dearborn, with their four sons, Peter, Lucian, Cornel, and Michael.

Besides his own family, accompanying Father Moga into the Church are several families of Rumanian descent who were his parishioners at St. Peter and Paul Orthodox church in Dearborn.

Anglican Vicar To Join Church

Bedford—(NC)—The Rev. Patrick Foort, Anglican rector in nearby Clifton, has revealed he is preparing to be received in the Catholic Church.

After attending Mass alone at his local Catholic church for five Sundays, he was joined by his wife and three children, who have now decided to follow him. Mr. Foort's churchwarden in Clifton became a Catholic a year and a half ago.

The Clifton church antedates the Reformation by two centuries.

London—(NC)—A Jewish salesman who was introduced to the Catholic Faith by posing as a model for Simon of Cyrene for a Catholic sculptor's statues of the Cross plans to enter the Church.

He is Nigel Ivan Stone, who agreed to pose for sculptor Philip Lindsey Clark, when they met by chance at a wedding reception.

Low Cost Housing Urged In Slum Clearance Job

United Nations—(RNS)—Mggr. John O'Grady of New York, an authority on community development and United Nations representative for the International Conference of Catholic Charities, declared here that the clearance of slums and the building of low-cost housing should go hand-in-hand.

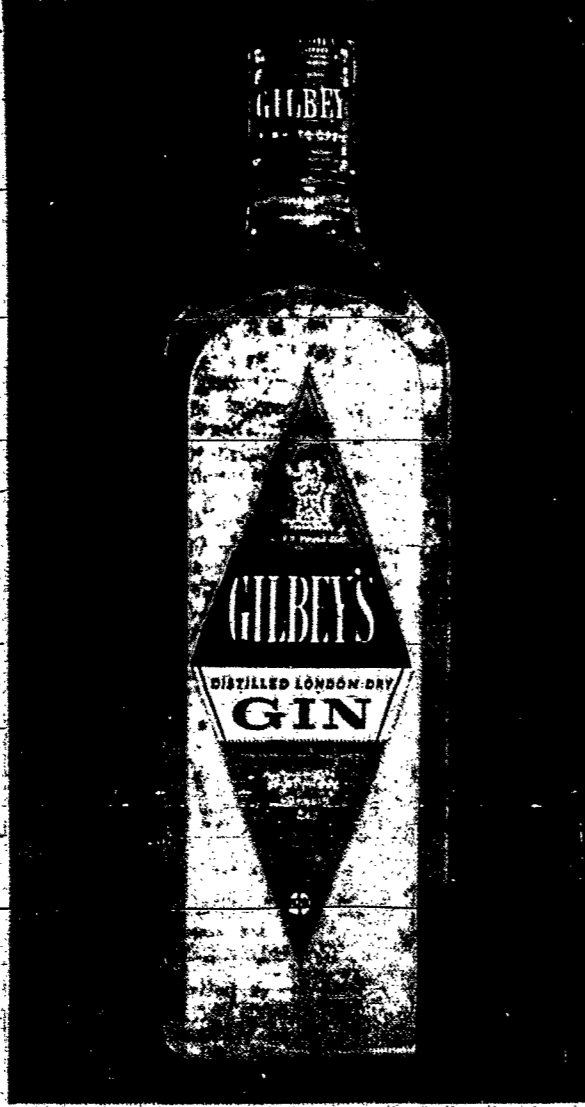
The prelate addressed the UN Social Commission after it unanimously adopted a resolution recommending that governments speed up their low-cost housing programs.

He criticized the wide-spread practice in the United States of "centering attention on slum

clearance to the neglect of housing supply." The result is, he said, that many people cleared from the slum sites are forced to crowd into new slums.

Mggr. O'Grady said that while the incidence of low-income families lags in the U.S., the outlook is brighter in some other lands. In the new African state of Ghana, he reported, "housing and urban slum clearance fall into a natural place as part of a redevelopment program."

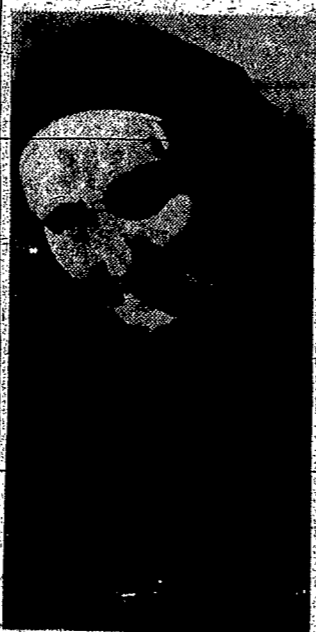

Oldest Nun

Rome—(RNS)—On her 100th birthday, Sister Maria Melena Ernst, Swiss-born nun, is in perfect health. She resides at the San Pietro Claver missionary house in Rome. Believed to be the oldest nun in Europe, she has seen seven Popes, served as a missionary and traveled widely in Africa, Asia and America.

Texas Size Jungle

Primitive Brazil Mission

Jefferson City, Mo.—Imagine the church operating in an area like this:—almost the size of the state of Texas.

About 200,000 square miles of jungle—almost the size of the state of Texas.

No roads, just a wide river filled with commercial vessels but only by privately owned motor boats.

A population of 30,000 natives, practically all Catholics.

Add to the native population, uncounted thousands of wild, hostile Indians living a romantic Stone Age existence.

A force of one bishop, six priests, five Brothers and eight Sisters.

It's more than a fantastic imagination—it's a humbling description of the mission area of Xingu in north central Brazil.

The authority for the statistics is a 25-year veteran of missionary labors along the Xingu River, Father Erich Krautler, C.P.P.S.

The Xingu (pronounced "zingu") is the last large river that flows into the Amazon from the south. The mission headquarters, Altavira, is a settlement of 2,500 on the Xingu River, which

measures four miles across at this point, eight miles wide where it empties into the Amazon.

FATHER KRAUTLER, Austrian born Precious Blood Father, stopped here to visit Bishop Joseph Marling, also a member of the congregation of the Precious Blood. The 52-year-old missionary is on his way to a general chapter of the Precious Blood Fathers to be held in Rome.

Father Krautler described missionaries' problems typified by an Indian chief whom he visits regularly in the untamed jungle.

"When I spoke to him of Baptism, he replied that he would wait until he was older. He wanted to be baptized but not yet as then he knew he would have to stop killing enemies Indians and he was not ready for that," Father Krautler said.

From the ecclesiastical point of view, Brazil also presents a living picture: for about 58 million Catholics there are no more than 3,000 priests, about half of whom have come as missionaries from foreign lands. (Catholic figures on the Church in the United States count 39.5 million Catholics with almost 53,000 priests.)

Bias Kills Rhode Island Housing Bill

Providence—(NC)—The proposed Rhode Island Bill for Fair Practices in Housing died in committee after causing more controversy than any other bill in years.

The measure proposed prohibiting discriminatory practices in the selling, renting or leasing of housing accommodations based upon the race, color, religion or country of ancestral origin of the applicants.

Because of the dispute over the bill, it was amended to the point where it became unacceptable to both its supporters and its opponents, and was not brought up to a vote before the general assembly adjourned.

The amendments would have stripped a proposed administrative commission of all enforcement power and set up a trial by jury for bringing suit for damages against an offender.
