

Fr. Fishette Named Dean At John Fisher College

Rev. Robert Fishette, C.S.B., assistant professor of Education at St. John Fisher College, has been named Dean of the Rochester men's college, according to the Very Rev. Charles J. Lavary, C.S.B., president.

Father Fishette replaces Rev. John O'Meara, C.S.B., who has been transferred to Assumption University, Windsor, Canada.

Both Fathers Fishette and O'Meara are native Rochesterians.

A GRADUATE of Aquinas Institute, Father Fishette served the school as vice principal and

director of studies. He has worked in many education committees in Rochester and New York State.

In announcing the changes in the faculty at a board of regents meeting this week, Father Lavary paid particular tribute to the work of Father O'Meara in the establishment of St. John Fisher College.

Father O'Meara became Dean in 1951, and with Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B., first president, was greatly responsible for the recognition given to the college by the community and educational authorities.

He will resume his teaching career at Assumption University in the Department of Sociology.

Other changes at the men's college are as follows:

Rev. Alphonsus Malene, C.S.B., professor of Psychology, will join the faculty of Assumption University.

Rev. John McReavy, C.S.B., of the department of Philosophy, has been transferred to the University of St. Thomas, Houston, Texas.

Rev. John Cavanaugh, C.S.B., has been given a leave of absence to continue graduate studies at the University of St. Louis.

Four priests have been appointed to the St. John Fisher staff:

Fathers Hetzler and Trovato are also Rochesterians.

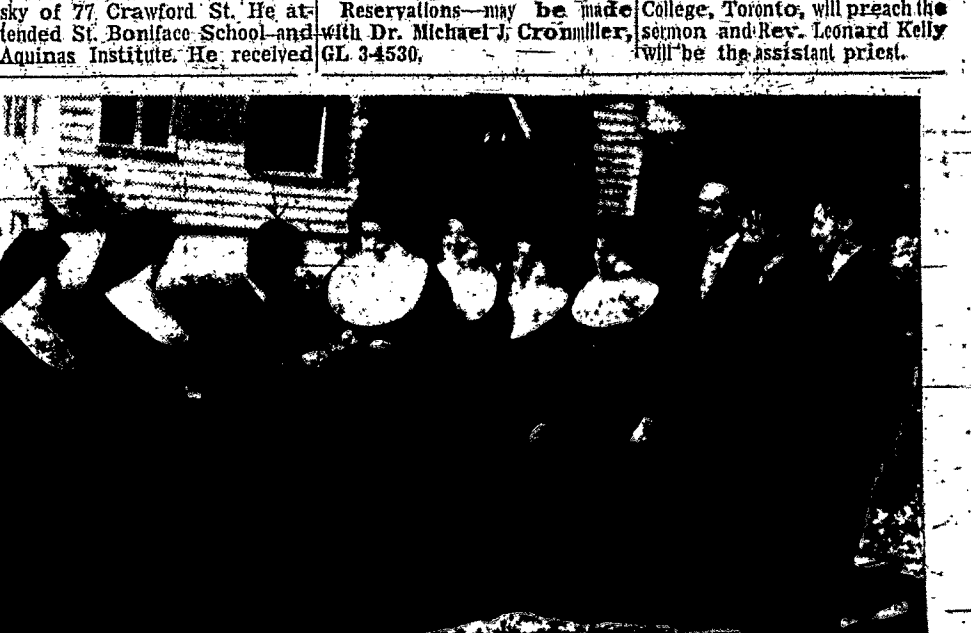
