Enrollments are now being accepted for the annual summer schedule of "Learn To Swim" and "Tiny Tot" classes.

"Learn To Swim" classes are designed for youngsters six through fourteen years of age, with a concentrated effort being placed on the floating and fundamental instruction in "crawl" stroke. These classes are limited in size so that the most effective results can be attained. There will be one instructor to each eight to ten youngsters.

"Tiny Tot" swim classes are designed for four to six year olds. These classes are given a concentrated effort to acclimate youngsters to the water and make ready for transition to playful fun in floating and swimming.

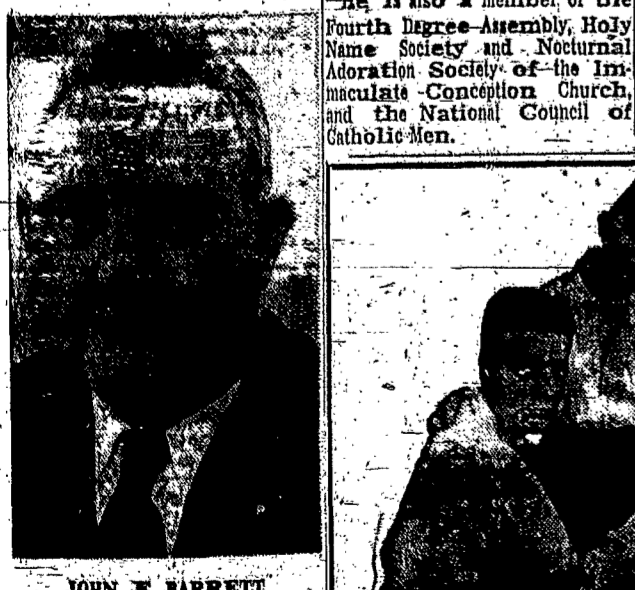

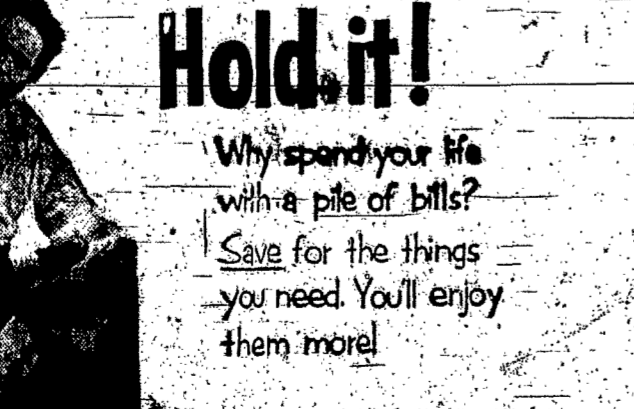
## KC Chalice To Be Given
