

# Msgr. Sullivan Parish Founder

MONSIGNOR JOHN B. SULLIVAN, founder of St. John the Evangelist parish, Rochester, after 34 years in the priesthood, has retired from active duty. Bishop Kearney this week named him pastor emeritus of the parish he pioneered in 1914.

The 80-year-old prelate, a native of Seneca Falls, is a diocesan consultant and a member of the board of directors of St. Elizabeth Guild House, offices he will continue to hold.

Monsignor Sullivan supervised construction of all parish buildings at St. John's—the church, school, rectory and convent. He marked his golden jubilee in the priesthood with Bishop Kearney, residing at the solemn Mass June 5, 1955.

Prior to his appointment as founder and first pastor of St. John's, Monsignor Sullivan was 9 years a curate at Corpus Christi Church.

While at Corpus Christi, he inaugurated a parochial school, baseball league. Over the years he has consistently promoted a full range of programs for youngsters.

Pope Pius XII elevated him with the title of Monsignor Oct. 10, 1947, to the rank of domestic prelate.

Rome — (RNS) — A statue of Christ in the heated village of Alipolito, located in the Abruzzi region of central Italy, has twice shown signs of bleeding in the hands, feet and side, according to reports received here.

The alleged miraculous event has attracted crowds of Roman Catholic pilgrims from nearby areas. However, ecclesiastical authorities have so far declined to make any official comment on the matter.

Other speakers will include U.S. Sen. Eugene McCarthy of Minnesota; Stephen Mitchell, Chicago attorney and former chairman of the Democratic National Committee; John Coey, writer, and Dr. Jerome Kerwin, educator.

The movement headquarters said delegates are expected from every state in the country, Canada, Mexico, Central and South America, India, Japan, the Philippines, Australia, New Zealand, Africa, England, Scotland, Denmark, India and Poland.

## U.S. Relief Supplies Aid Refugees In Hong Kong

Hong Kong — (NC) — Fifty tons of relief supplies from the U.S. were delivered here by the aircraft carrier USS Shangri-La to aid thousands of destitute refugees.

More than 11,000 refugees were left without shelter or food as torrential rains and landslides demolished their shacks and swept away their meager belongings.

The relief shipment of food, clothing, medicines and household goods came from religious and social organizations in California, Arizona, Nevada, and other West-coast regions as part of "Operation Handclasp," the U.S. Navy's contribution to President Eisenhower's people-people program.

Distribution of the relief goods is being made through Catholic welfare agencies here under the direction of the Maryknoll Sisters, and the Church World Service (Protestant) relief centers.

## Clergy Rap Lurid Ads As Threat To Morals

New York — (NC) — Religious leaders of the major faiths here have issued a report citing newspapers, magazines, radio and television with contributing to a decline in the city's morals.

"The report, which reflected the views of a committee of 101 priests, ministers and rabbis, offered recommendations to the city and to the media for improving the moral climate."

It urged that newspapers ban lurid advertisements for motion pictures, that magazines ban "sensational articles and pictures" and that television reduce emphasis on crime and violence.

"The mass media industry, once conscious of this parasitic presence in its midst, must itself assume a responsibility for eliminating these degrading and degrading practices," the report added.

## Notre Dame Priest Jubilees

Notre Dame — Three priests who have served the Congregation of Holy Cross—a total of 50 years—will observe the golden anniversary of their ordination here next weekend.

The jubilees, all ordained in Sacred Heart Church at the University of Notre Dame on June 26, 1909, are Rev. Eugene P. Burke, C.S.C., 75, who retired from the University faculty at the close of the school year; Rev. Cornelius J. Harty, C.S.C., 74, chaplain to the Brothers of Holy Cross at DuSable Hall here; and Rev. Thomas E. Irving, C.S.C., 73, resident confessor at Corby Hall, the priest's residence on the campus.

## Japanese Encyclopedia

Tokyo — (NC) — After 25 years of scholarship and research the final entry has been made in the exhaustive index that will go with the fifth and final volume of the Japanese Catholic Encyclopedia.

The entry was made by a German priest, Franciscan Father Felix Zeigler, who has directed the work for several years at the Jesuit Sophia University here.

The final volume of the encyclopedia is expected to be issued this year. The work first had been entrusted to Father John Kraus, S.J., who died in 1946.

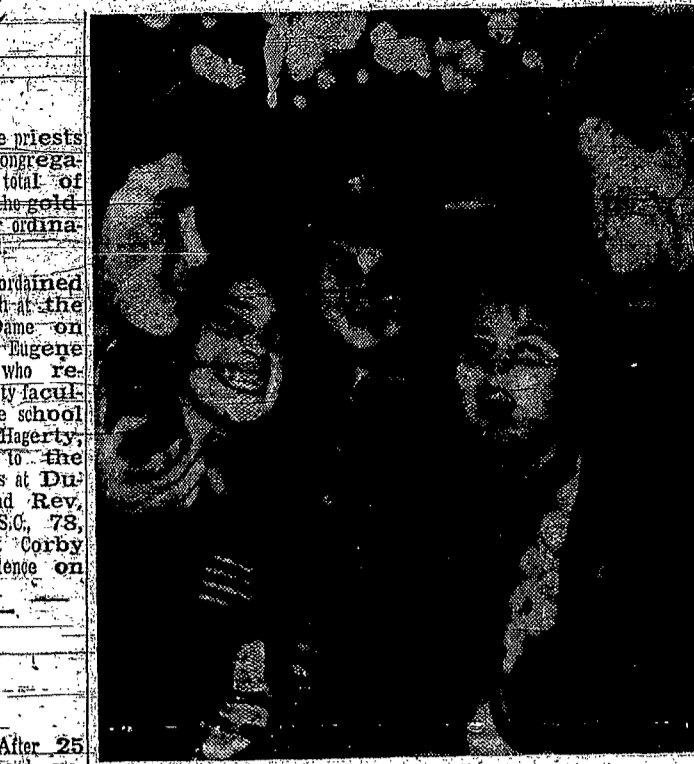
