

Two Rochester Women Take Final Vows In Rome

Two young Rochester women of the Congregation Our Lady of the Retreat in the Cenacle were among a group of several countries who made their final profession of vows in Rome.

The ceremonies held at the Vatican on June 16 and 17 were the last of a series of events which began in Rochester on June 10.

Mother Kathleen Flannigan, daughter of Mrs. Thomas R. Flannigan of 2924 Lake Ave. and the late Thomas R. Flannigan, was in the first group to take vows.

Mother Annette Matte, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John W. Matte of 308 Browncroft Blvd., was in the second group to take vows.

Mother Matte has been stationed in Boston and Middletown, Conn.

Other Americans were numbered in the two groups, including Mother Doris Cunningham, who, before going to Rome, was at the Rochester Retreat House.

An account of the above ceremonies was given by Mr. and Mrs. John W. Matte in the Courier Journal this week.

At the profession including their daughter, the Mattes reported Bishop Pietro C. Van Thiel, Superior to the Holy Father and Vicar General of the Vatican City officials and gave the sermon.

Monsignor Macelli was master of ceremonies. Assisting him were Rev. Richard Hanley, O.M.I., New York City and Rev. John W. McGee, C.S.B. of Washington D.C., a native of Rochester.

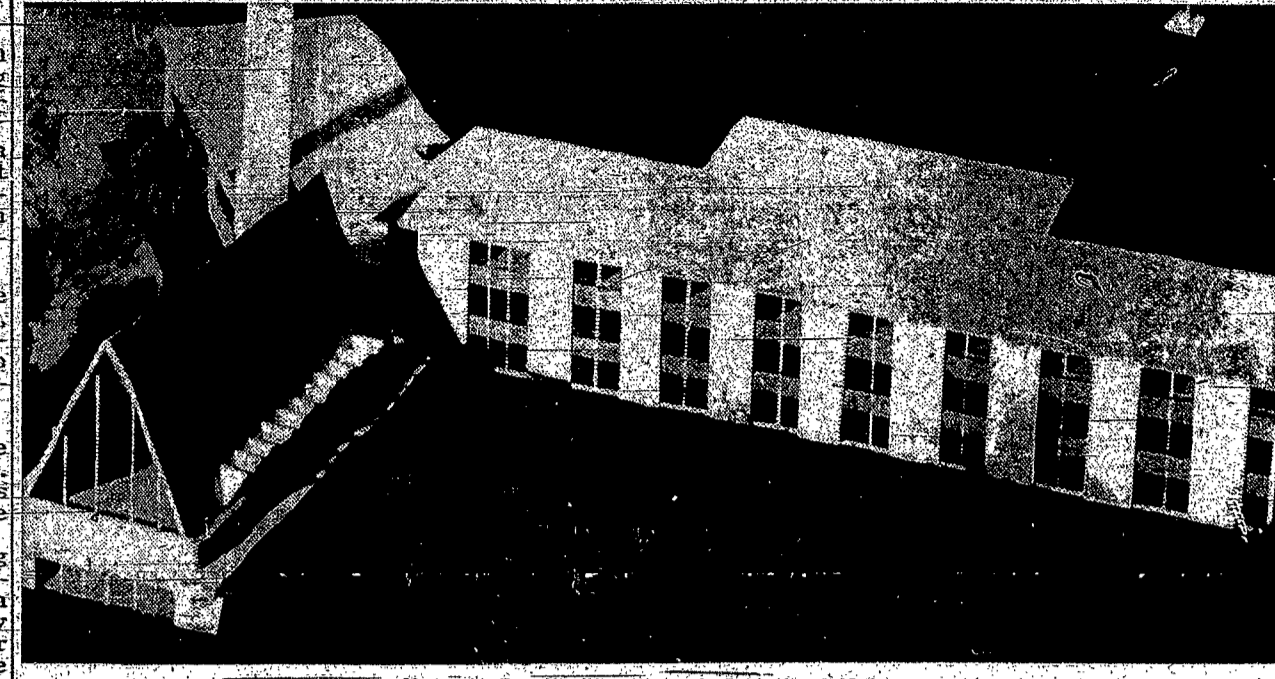

Novices Leave For New Home



New St. Basil's Novitiate in Pontiac, Mich.

Twenty-two young women, novices, boarded a Greyhound bus early last Friday morning and left Rochester for their new ultra-modern "home" in Pontiac, Mich.

St. Basil's Novitiate, 402 Augustine St., was founded in 1942 to house American applicants to the Basilian Order which staffs the Basilian Institute and St. John Fisher College.

The Novitiate was quartered in a wing of the Basilian Fathers' residence formerly the site of Nazareth College.

THE NEW Novitiate in Pontiac is capable of housing forty-two novices and four priests. Two miles from the city, the building is located on one of the highest points of land in the area and possesses a commanding view of the town and surrounding countryside.

Constructed in a "Y" shaped design, the focal point of the new novitiate will be a large stained glass window, a triangle approximately twenty feet in height. It was manufactured in Chartres, France, and is en route to this country. When installed, the window will be visible at night from downtown Pontiac.

THE INSIDE OF the novitiate is in keeping with its modern exterior. Of the forty-nine rooms, forty-five have a southern exposure with a magnificent view. Rooms are simply furnished and are equipped with running water.

Besides boarding facilities, the novitiate has its own chapel, gymnasium, lecture rooms and a refectory. The novices themselves will perform all household and maintenance work, except cooking.

The grounds are heavily wooded and will provide excellent solitude and a natural retreat, according to Rev. Francis J. Grescovich, C.S.B., rector and master of novices. Recreation grounds will be built by the novices and there is ample room for a small tract of vegetables.

FATHER GRESCOVIAK, who taught at Aquinas for 9 years and has been master of novices for 4 years at the Rochester novitiate, accompanied the novices on their trip to Pontiac.

Rev. William McGee, C.S.B., a former director of studies at Aquinas, has been named first counsellor and confessor at the Pontiac novitiate. Rev. Bernard Regan, C.S.B., is treasurer.

Six of this year's novices are natives of Rochester, 12 from Detroit, Mich., 2 from Texas, and one each from New York City and Philadelphia.
