Mixed Marriage Warning Voiced

San Francisco — (RNS) — Lutherans were warned against mixed marriages with other Protestants, as well as Roman Catholics and Jews, in a report presented at the 44th triennial convention here of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

Submitted by the denomination's Family Life Committee, the report cited statistical studies from Protestant and Catholic sources to show that the chief point of conflict in the large number of broken homes resulting from mixed marriages involves around religious differences and the education of children.

Citing "spiritual unity" as a primary concern of marriage, the synod's report stated that Lutheran Catholic weddings raise special problems because the two creeds differ in fundamental doctrines.
