### Queens DA Asks More Religion For Pupils

New York — (RNS) — Expanded release-time religious education programs were urged by a district attorney here as one way to curb juvenile delinquency. Frank D. O'Connor, Queens District Attorney, called for enlistment of lay volunteers to work with youth "on a local community and religious level" and for consideration of a course of "moral, philosophy, humanistic study, tailored to the age and development of the youngster."

Mr. O'Connor addressed the Queens County Grand Jurors association. Among other anti-delinquency measures, he suggested establishment of a youth commission to co-ordinate activities of various agencies, more recreation areas throughout the city in order "standards and incentives to encourage people to become professionals in the fight against delinquency," and formation of "Delinquents Anonymous" along the lines of Alcoholics Anonymous.

### Confession Restored

Atlanta — (NC) — The Bulgarian Orthodox Church has revived the practice of confession, according to reports reaching here. Announcement of the revival was made by Teodorov, Westnik, organ of the Bulgarian Orthodox Church. Although confession was never officially abolished in the Orthodox religion, it had ceased to exist in practice.
