

Fatima's Lucy Denies 'Punishment' Prophecy

Lisbon —(RNS)— Sister Lucy, the only survivor of the three children who saw the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima, denied having made any prophecies

Her-denial followed the publication of an article in which Father Agostinho Fuentes, self styled Roman postulator for the beatification cause of the two other Fatima children, Jacinta and Francisco, quoted Sister Lucy as having stated that "God is going to punish the world and very soon."

Other, statements attributed to Sister Lucy, a Discalced Carmelite at Coimbra, were that "the Blessed Virgin is very sad because no one heeds her message" and that "many nations will disappear from the face of the earth, and Russia will be the instrument of chastisement unless all of us by prayer and sacrifice, obtain the conversion of that poor nation."

A statement issued by ecclesiastical authorities of the Coimbra diocese said they had questioned Sister Lucy on her interview and she denied having spoken to Father Fuentes about anything except the possible beatification of her two cousins, Jacinta and Francisco.

Special Exhortations Given Clergy, Laity

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope John XXIII, the first encyclical letter of his pontificate, solemnly exhorted world leaders to remember that "God created men not as enemies but as brothers" and that "if the fires of discord are setablaze in the world again" nothing else a waits all people "but appalling destruction and ruin."

He urged statesmen especially "to-try everypossible approach" which may lead to the essential "harmony and unity" by which alone "the joint prosperity of nations will undoubtedly be

Entitled, "Ad Petri Cathedram" (To the Chair of Peter) from its opening words, the 10,000-word encyclical, lengthy excerps of which were broadcast by the Vatican Radio in many languages, was in Latin and was said to have been entirely the Pope's own work.

In addition to mankind's desire for peace, the encyclical issued under the official heading "On Promoting, Under the Impulse of Charity, Truth, Unity and Peace," stressed the responsibility of the press, the movies and television in upholding and fostering truth and morality, as well as the Pope's earnest desire-for-Christian unity-which-had-impelled-him to summon an Ecumenical Council in 1961.
