Rear Entrance To Bank Planned

When Marine Midland Trust Company of Southern New York provided a customer parking lot on the site of the old Park Hotel last summer, it met with immediate and continued use.

Along with the expressed approval of many customers, however, was some comment that they wished its entrance were closer to the entrance to the main office of the bank.

After much study of safety considerations, among them the safety of customers using the rear driveway as a short cut around the bank, a rear entrance from the parking lot to the main office lobby has been designed.

Customers may then leave the lot through pedestrian openings at the end of the lot facing Carrol St. and enter a covered walk to be constructed along the north side of the building. Entrance will be through a door and corridor emerging into the lobby just east of the paying and receiving tellers windows.

Bank officials state the work on the new entrance will be under way within a few days and completed about three weeks later.
