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Catholic Man Of Year Award Given Waverly Man

Waverly - The title of Penn. Valley Catholic Man of the Year was recently conferred on Harry S. Schreck, a member of St. James church.

The announcement was made at the annual breakfast for fathers and sons sponsored by the Waverly American Legion, 400 Waverly Avenue, on Sunday morning.

Schreck was presented with a plaque during his name as the 1959 Valley Catholic Man of the Year after being introduced by the Rev. G. Stuart Hogan, pastor of St. James.

THE AWARD was given to Schreck on the basis of his church work. The most recent project in which he was a moving force was the "Car for the Sisters" and drive in Waverly, through which an automobile was provided for the St. James parochial school faculty.

He is also very active in the Knights of Columbus and has been its secretary for many years.

FATHER HOGAN paid tribute to the two Knights of Columbus councils for their part in Catholic activities during the year and then cited the background upon which the choice of Schreck was made.
