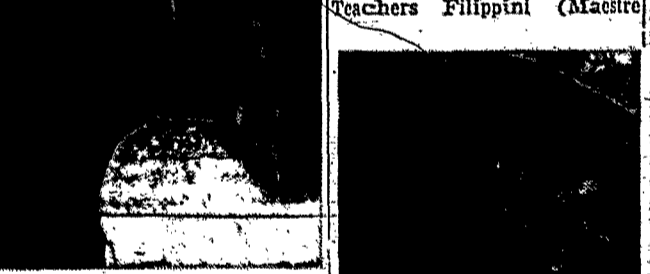
An intensive program of reading, writing and discussion is aimed at preparing the girls for college days ahead. Creative writing ability is fostered and encouraged.
