Covered Wagon

The days of adventure, combined with real family "togetherness" are NOT over.

Witness the Arnett family: father, mother, eight children, eldest not yet 14, youngest not yet 2, celebrating his first birthday.

Today they put on and truck into gear for a 4,000-mile round-trip to the Sonora desert in southwestern United States and down into Mexico in search of a rare species of beetles and a lot of family fun.

Catholic University scientist Dr. Ros H. Arnett, Jr., age 40 and with a red beard that gives him a professional look and will save him staving time, has taken the trip twice before in his basic research into the study

This summer, 11 month-old Matthew, his brothers and sisters, father and mother, will travel in comfort in a Volkswagen. On the inside, along both sides and across the front, Dr. Arnett has built bunk beds for six. The lower three are stacked, the upper three are covered with foam rubber mattresses. The upper three are canvas and white, also with rubber and foam. Into the "free" center space, they put portable cribs for the two babies, Matthew and Teresa, two.

THIS ACCOUNTS for only eight? Right. The other two Arnetts, Ross H. III, 15, and Michael, 14, as well as Dr. Arnett's student assistant, will sleep in jungle hammocks strung between trees.

Along the sides of the truck, between upper and lower bunks, are cupboards for dishes, cooking utensils, foodstuffs, tools, lab equipment and the Professor's reference books.

We saw the Arnetts two days before take-off, at an impromptu press conference at their home in Bladensburg, Maryland. The male reporters were most interested in Dr. Arnett's scientific studies and what his information would mean to find, I was — and I'm sure my readers are too — concerned more about Mrs. Arnett's summer, and that of the eight lively youngsters.

"How do you know what to take for three months in the desert — for 11 weeks?" I asked, appalled at the very thought.

BLOND YOUNG Mrs. Arnett, boosted sobbing little Joe, the only her son, as far as the truck is to a bumper forward.

"Well," she smiled, "we figuratively drew a circle around all the things we need here at home — need as essentials. Then we packed the last of the truck and car. What didn't fit, we're leaving home. There will be toys and games and dolls, of course," she nodded reassuringly at Frances, five, and Barbara, seven.

"But, cooking?" I asked, "AFK washing..."

"We have two portable stoves," she answered calmly. "There's always water, soap and a wash board. During our metropolitan winter lives, we're inclined to forget the rough of rope strung between two trees makes a wonderful drier — and doubles as a jump rope."

"Our life will be simple," she continued, untying a knot in Barbara's legs, "but if we waited for the children to grow up, we'd never go — and we all want to be together."

When they get to the desert, life will be all outdoors for the Arnetts — sleeping, cooking, living with nature. In the meantime, there is the trip...

If truck and car should become separated, they have arranged for a man to call their next-door neighbor in the east. The first lost Arnett will give his or her location, then the second Arnett will receive the message from the neighbor. They'll make out.

This summer, we venture to say, will yield not only valuable scientific data but, just as important, a never-to-be-forgotten experience of living for members of a courageous family — the Arnetts, God bless 'em!

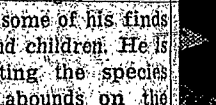
No Substitute For Catechists

"We can see that many children will not be reached unless your numbers increase," he told graduates of the Los Angeles diocesan Confraternity of Christian Doctrine training program.

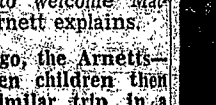
The graduation class, totaling 370 men and women, was the largest in the history of the archdiocese.



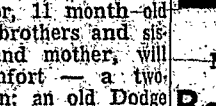
