**Youngsters Participate In College Reading Workshop**

Thirty-five second-grade boys and girls from St. Jerome's School in East Rochester are being introduced to "Adventure in the World of Books" at Nazareth College this summer. These second graders are the subjects in a Reading Demonstration Program in connection with the course in Reading Techniques, which is being taught to 40 elementary teachers in the parochial schools in the Rochester Diocese in the Elementary Teacher Education Division of Nazareth College. The course is conducted on a workshop basis with the first two weeks devoted to theory, followed by three weeks of laboratory work with the children. The last week will be devoted to discussion of the students' observations and a summary. Teachers of the course are Sister Francis Camilla, S.S.J., and Sister Madeline Therese, S.S.J., experienced elementary teachers and reading specialists, who have had unusual success in teaching young children to read. Both of these Sisters hold Master's degrees in Education. IN ADDITION to the formal training in reading techniques for young teachers, the Sisters of Saint Joseph are also offering remedial reading for pupils from grade 4 to grade 9 in five centers in Rochester — Corpus Christi, St. Anthony's, St. John's, St. Monica's and Nazareth Hall. Teachers of these groups are experienced Sisters with special training in remedial reading techniques. The work is being done under the supervision of Sister M. Mallida, S.S.J., Director of Remedial Reading in the elementary schools conducted by the Sisters of Saint Joseph.
