

## Sacrament Scholars To Attend Meeting

Conception, Mo. — (NC) — An institute of sacramental theology will be held in conjunction with the North American Liturgical Week at the University of Notre Dame, it was announced here by Father Maur Burbach, O.S.B., member of the board of directors of the National Liturgical Conference and director of the institute.

FATHER BURBACH, rector of Conception Seminary here, said the institute was planned by conference officials to bring together some of the leading scholars in sacramental theology.

The institute will provide an opportunity for a detailed dis-

ussion of scholarly papers on the liturgy that is deemed inappropriate for the general and more popular sessions of the Liturgical Week, it was explained.

Members of the Catholic Theological Society of America, seminary professors, and others have been invited to attend the institute, said Father Burbach. The institute will be conducted August 25 and 26. The Liturgical Week will open August 23 and close on the 28th.

### Tuna Casserole

#### Elegant-Economical



There are times when we all have to be economical in whatever we do. As much as we would love to have steak for dinner frequently, we turn to something a little more practical such as a casserole.

So many homemakers tell me that they enjoy casserole cookery, not only for their families but also when they entertain. Casserole cookery eliminates that last minute preparation. To complete the meal, add a crisp, cool salad, a vegetable and perhaps a simple dessert. The thing that most of us do not realize, is that casseroles can be challenging. Challenging in preparation, challenging in appearance, . . . challenging in flavor. Take Cheese Biscuit Crowned Casserole for instance. It is a delicious, economical, elegant casserole for family or friends.

"Canned tuna is a familiar item in almost every American home and on every grocery man's shelf. Here's a new one that fills the bill exactly. . . . twin flavor treat called "Cookie-Mint Log" that can be made in a jiffy a whole day ahead of time and left to chill until guests arrive.

**CHEESE BISCUIT CROWNED CASSEROLE**

1 1/2 c. butter  
1/2 c. chopped green pepper  
1 small onion, sliced  
1 ounce can button mushrooms  
1/2 c. flour  
1/4 t. salt  
1/4 t. pepper  
1 1/2 c. evaporated milk, plus water to make 3 c. liquid  
2 c. chopped pimiento  
1-7 ounces can tuna fish, drained  
1 T. lemon juice

Melt butter. Add green pepper, onion and mushrooms and cook until lightly browned. Add flour, salt and pepper. Stir until well blended. Add evaporated milk and water slowly and stir until well blended. When thick and smooth, bring to a boil and boil for 2 minutes. Add pimiento, tuna fish and lemon juice. Pour into well-buttered 2 quart casserole. Top with cheese biscuits.

### Reds Balk Pilgrimage

Munich, Germany — (RNS) — Roman Catholic authorities in West Germany charged Communist authorities in the Soviet Zone with preventing East German believers, for the first time in 27 1/2 years, from participating in the annual journey to Waddern, a famous Catholic pilgrimage center near here.

East German Catholics from the Elbehead, a diaspora region of the Catholic diocese of Fulda, West Germany, in the past have always made up a substantial part of the pilgrims. But they were conspicuously absent from this year's pilgrimage, which was attended by some 100,000 Catholics from all West German dioceses as well as from France, Belgium and Holland.

### Aid Scheduled For Hong Kong

Cologne, Germany — (RNS) — Bishop Lorenzo Bianchi of Hong Kong met with Joseph Cardinal Frings, Archbishop of Cologne, to map plans for continued aid by German Catholics to refugees in the British Crown Colony.

White in Aachen, Bishop Bianchi called on the German headquarters of the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith. He was told there by Msgr. Nikolaus Mund, director of the branch, that an initial \$325,000 will be made available to the Hong Kong diocese from a Lenten fundraising drive.

### Missioner Says Moslem Gains Can Be Matched

Moshi, Tanganyika — (NC) — Islam, which has been spreading faster than Christianity in many parts of Africa, can be halted in Tanganyika and in the Congo, a priest-expert on the Moslem religion stated here.

During a visit to the Moshi diocese Father Franz Schilcknecht, W.F.R., who has conducted special studies of Islam in various parts of the continent, said the time has come to begin an apostolate among the Moslems and to abandon the defeatist attitude that it is impossible to convert them.

He reported that plans are being prepared to instruct the African laity, which he hopes will play the major role in seeking to convert Moslems. Such work by African Catholic laymen, he said, should help overcome the idea that Christianity is a white man's religion.

Laymen, he added, can also find means not available to missionaries of contacting Moslems, whose number about two million in Tanganyika, or approximately a quarter of the whole population.

Father Schilcknecht also pointed out that the ordinary adherent of Islam in a number of African areas has never known the true Moslem religion.

The religion the African embraced, the White Father said, has often been a mixture of fetishism and some Modern tenets. It has also been an easy religion to enter, he continued.

Very little preliminary instruction has been required and upon admission the African received a new name and wore a new type of clothing which gave him greater prestige in his community.

Religious practice has consisted of paying a religious tax, fasting during the month of Ramadan, praying five times a day going to a mosque on Fridays.

Opposition, however, has arisen from the realization that Islam has done little for the social improvement of the people, the priest said. He pointed out that there is considerable movement of population in Tanganyika.
