

Equal Wealth Said Needed For Peace

Geneva — (NC) — It would be "a major factor for world peace" if the various nations accepted the fact that God created the goods of the universe for the use of all men, not for private or national profit, a United Nations body was told here.

ANDRE DELAHOUSSE, representing Pax Romana, the International Catholic Movement for Intellectual and Cultural Affairs, said the time has come when both the "have" and "have-not" countries must make an intensive review of the world economic situation.

Mr. Delahousse made his statements before the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations of the U.N. Economic Survey.

He told the U.N. body: "A world economy based on freely accepted interdependence will be a major factor for world peace if nations, respectful of each other's sovereignty, will agree to allow all men to draw their subsistence from the wealth of the universe, which God created for all men, forbidding anyone or any nation to divert this wealth for personal or national profit without taking account of the vital needs of others."

Moscow Mass In Kremlin's Shadow

Moscow — (RNS) — In his first year as chaplain to the American Catholic community in Moscow, Father Louis A. Dion, A.A., of Worcester, Mass., offers the Sacrifice in a chapel in the library of the French Embassy. Formerly registrar of Assumption College in Worcester, Father Dion was the first U.S. priest assigned to Moscow since early in 1955, when his predecessor, Father Georges Bissonette, A.A., was forced to leave. Father Dion concluded the Mass with the customary prayers for the conversion of Russia.

Cuba Peasants Needs Defended

Havana — (NC) — The peasant population is "the most disinherited class" in Cuba, so it must be the main goal of land reform to raise the standard of living of the peasants, a Cuban Bishop declared here.

In a magazine article on the land reform program adopted by the government of Premier Fidel Castro, Bishop Alberto Martin y Villaverde of Matanzas said:

"Even though there exist deplorable points in the recent law, as Catholics we should be glad that there is an agrarian reform."
Bishop Martin added: "We should pray to God to enlighten those who implement it so that they will accomplish its essential purpose — to obtain a more decent way of life for our peasants."

Warning against possible Red influence in the land reform program, the prelate said:

"The communist ideal, that the lands should sooner or later belong to the State, is contrary to Christian principles because it tends to make man a slave of public authority. Whatever form the Cuban agrarian reform may take in the future, it should carefully avoid having the peasant become excessively dependent on the State."

Protestants Use Catholic Catechism

Copenhagen — (NC) — A magazine issued by the Danish High Church (Protestant) has recommended that the new Danish Catholic catechism be used by the evangelical faithful.

The magazine, "Reformation," stated: "Until the Danish People's Church acquires a new catechism which is suitable for instruction, it seems not at all improbable to us that many a clergyman will be able to use this Roman Catholic catechism with profit when he has to prepare himself for school instruction or for confirmation classes."

The Danish Catholic catechism is a translation of the German unified catechism, which appeared for the first time in the Danish language shortly before Christmas, 1958.

Aged Chinese Flee Red Terror

Muong Sitg, Laos — (NC) — A Red edict ordering the execution of all feeble persons over 60 is responsible for arrival of a stream of refugees coming across the border to this Laotian town, it was reported here by an American Catholic doctor.

According to Dr. Thomas Dooley, former U.S. Navy doctor who has set up a clinic here, the communist commissar of Menghwa in communist China's Yunnan province has ordered the execution of all feeble men and women over 60 who cannot take part in the work program of the local Red commune.

As a result, he noted, large numbers of the doomed people

are sneaking across the border and are being cared for at the clinic he founded with the help of two medical assistants, Earl Rhine and Dwight Davis of Austin, Texas.

In addition to the emergency care given these refugees, Dr. Dooley reported, his primitive three-building "medical center" is able to average of 100000 patients daily. The small frame buildings house an outpatient clinic, operating room and a hospital ward.

Dr. Dooley, a graduate of Notre Dame University and St. Louis University Medical School, first became interested in the medical plight of southeast Asia in 1954 when as a Navy doctor he was assigned to give medical aid to many of the millions of refugees fleeing from communist persecution in North Vietnam.

New Michigan Monastery Conducted By Lutherans

Oxford, Mich. — (RNS) — Monastic life among Lutherans, not unfamiliar in Europe, has been planted in the United States through the work of a Swedish Lutheran clergyman.

He is the Rev. Arthur Carl Kresinheider, the superior and one of the founders of the Congregation of the Servants of Christ established here last year.

The congregation's life at St. Augustine's House, Oxford, is centered in the Holy Eucharist, sacramental life, confession and liturgical piety. Members take vows of poverty, celibacy and obedience.

Sentenced To Mass

San Francisco — (RNS) — Municipal Judge Andrew J. Byman said his order that an 18-year-old Catholic probationer attend Mass every Sunday for two years was designed to rehabilitate the youth without sending him to jail and was not, as has been suggested, intended to force the boy to attend church as a condition of his remaining free.

Judge Byman was replying to a charge made by the American Civil Liberties Union which declared that "the state or government has no right to require support or adherence to any faith" as such a condition.

"I think the Union is crazy about this," the judge said. "It's expressing an opinion without knowing the background of the case."

He noted that when William J. Korpa pleaded guilty to a charge of beating up two guests at a beach party, the youth's mother agreed a good probation condition would be that she attend Mass with Korpa for two years. Another condition was that he stop drinking.

Pope Counsels New Nations

Angers, France — (RNS) — Pope John XXIII, in greetings to the 48th Semaine Sociales (Social Weeks) here, declared that the world's new nations must be made to realize the importance of Christianity's essential message — unity and true peace.

The Pontiff addressed his letter to some 2,000 delegates from 12 countries, including the U.S., gathered at the Catholic University of Angers to study and define the Christian attitude toward problems facing young and underdeveloped nations.

Conferees also received a message from Domenico Cardinal Tardini, Vatican Secretary of State, in which he urged Catholic public officials in new countries not to place power and prestige before cultural and economic development.

"Catholics who take part in the public life of such young nations faced with fearful problems of development, which independence alone does not solve," he said, "must have a clear vision of the present and future in order to be able to insist on the importance of effective cultural and economic progress, rather than allowing sterile emphasis on prestige and power to develop."

The Social Weeks are one week Catholic educational seminars held annually. Besides the Belgian Catholic University of Louvain, representatives came from Africa, Madagascar, Tahiti, Martinique, South Vietnam, Poland and Western Europe.

Other speakers stressed that Christian charity cannot accept inequality of any kind and that social, economic and political justice must be developed as part of the Christian doctrine of respect for the human being.

Congo Reactor Installed

Leopoldville — (RNS) — The first atomic reactor on the African continent has been installed at the Lovanium, the Leopoldville section of the Belgian Catholic University of Louvain.
