Victor Mature, Red Buttons and Rhonda Fleming top a good cast in this raucous lavishly filmed, stocked with tinted elephants. Running for 108 minutes this flicker has a tendency to become rather pedestrian through the use of such cliches as a circus fire, an escaped lion, a misty saboteur, etc., but at the same time is skillfully constructed to give the most dramatic moments free rein.
