## Philosophers Needed More Than Scientists

Davenport — (NC) — American Catholic colleges and universities, according to Bishop John J. Wright of Pittsburgh, probably turn out their share of graduates who, though not "professional intellectuals," are nourished by such intellectual fare as good books, good conversation and good music.

BISHOP WRIGHT said in an interview here that he welcomed the debate on Catholics and the intellectual life which began in Catholic circles several years ago. The debate speeded the end of the anti-intellectualism in the air at that time and helped force it "underground," he said.

However, said the Bishop, he never shared the contention that our Catholic colleges and universities, or our schools on any level, had proved "intellectually deficient" in turning out people appreciative of the intellectual life.

"I never went along with the thesis of some who seemed to feel that our schools had 'let us down' by a failure to produce competent intellectuals."

### Arrests Follow Riot To Save Town Chapel

Krasnik-Fabrycny — (RNS) — Townspeople in this southeast Polish town say at least 300 persons have been arrested in the wake of a pitched battle here between police and Roman Catholics June 26.

The disturbance erupted when local Red authorities ordered a Catholic chapel to be torn down. Townsfolk claim more than 1,500 persons took part in the ensuing riot but Communist authorities said no more than several hundred participated.

TADEUSZ MARX, chairman of the local National Council and secretary of the United Workers' (Communist) party, said only 20 persons were under arrest.

He said the troubles were inspired by a group of "fanatical women" who led a march on the town hall and police station after municipal officials ordered the chapel torn down, on the ground that it had been built without a license.

Krasnik-Fabrycny is a "new town" of 10,000 built around a metallurgical factory 15 miles from Lublin. In building the community, the Communists carefully omitted any plans for a church but an official committee of Catholics raised funds to build a chapel on the vacant lot and invited visiting priests to say Mass there.

### U. S. Priest Consecrated For Europe Eastern Rite

Philadelphia — (NC) — The Most Rev. Platon V. Korynjak, former Chancellor of the Ukrainian Archdiocese of Philadelphia, was consecrated Apostolic Exarch for Ukrainian Catholics residing in Germany.

The ceremony took place in the Ukrainian Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception here.

It was the first time that a Byzantine Rite Bishop for Ukrainian Catholics was consecrated in the United States for an exarchy in Europe. He was named to the post in April by Pope John XXIII.

Archbishop Constantine Bakhayevsky, head of the Metropolitan See of Philadelphia and spiritual leader of Ukrainian prelate, Co-consecrators were Bishop Ambrose Senyshyn, O.S.B.M. of Stamford, Conn., and Auxiliary Bishop Joseph M. Schmoniluk of Philadelphia.

Prelates of both Latin and Byzantine Rite, hundreds of priests and faithful filled the Cathedral for the three-hour ceremony.

### Mercy To Millions Refugees Needs Cited

New York — (RNS) — Representatives of some 40 religious and other non-governmental groups which are members of the American Council of Voluntary Agencies for Foreign Service joined here in launching the World Refugee Year in this country.

Protestant, Roman Catholics and Jewish leaders were among more than 700 persons attending a luncheon which marked the council's 16th anniversary of successful co-operation in behalf of millions of refugees.

Mrs. Edward E. Swanstrom of New York told the guests that the council "represents the pluralism of American society—a pluralism that is ethnic, religious and cultural." He is executive director of Catholic Relief Services-National Catholic Welfare Conference, and the Council's chairman.

Dean Francis B. Sayre, Jr. of Washington Cathedral (Episcopal) lauded refugees as assets to countries receiving them. They represent he said, "the best among their countrymen for they lacked hardship and are death to live as free men." Dean Sayre is chairman of the U.S. Committee for Refugees, organized to promote the World Refugee Year.

Delivering the keynote address, Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.) called for a WRY appeal that would be personal rather than organizational. "Let us be sensitive to the needs and wants of people—"

### Churches Die In Grip Of China Communists

Hong Kong — (NC) — All except one Catholic church in the big northern Chinese port city of Tientsin have been closed, it was reported here.

THE SOLE remaining church is said to be the Tientsin cathedral, which is understood to be badly in need of repairs.

At the same time, it was reported that only one church is open in Swatow, southern port on the Formosa strait. The Communist regime reportedly decided to turn the Swatow cathedral into an exposition hall, and the bishop's residence is occupied in part by a chemical fertilizer commission and by the so-called Patriotic Association of Chinese Catholics.
