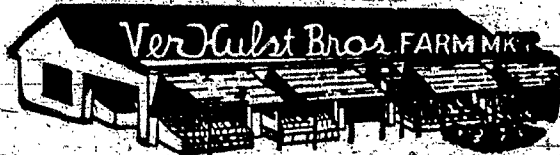

Easy Court Sentences Aid Smut

Washington—(NC)—The chairman of a House postal subcommittee investigating the obscenity problem complained here that light court sentences given smut peddlers are a major impediment to efforts to put them out of business.

Rep. Kathryn B. Granahan of Pennsylvania charged that "the minimal sentences handed down by certain United States courts amount to no more than a 'license fee' for distributors of mail order obscenity."
 Rep. Granahan pointed out that violations of anti-obscenity laws are "offenses against the public morals and inflict indignity on the public conscience."
 "Sentences bearing no reasonable relationship to the seriousness of such an offense against the public or which are inadequate to the point of absurdity," he said, "neither carry out the intent of the law nor serve the public purpose for which the laws are enacted," she added.

Rep. Granahan said investigations conducted by her subcommittee show the "ineffectiveness and lack of uniformity in sentencing have been major weaknesses in efforts to implement the anti-obscenity laws."

Cure Of Ars Centenary

Ars, France—(RNS)—On Aug. 4, the 100th anniversary of the death of St. John Vianney, thousands of pilgrims will flock to Ars, France, to honor the humble French cure who was proclaimed by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as the principal patron saint of the diocesan clergy throughout the world. This engraving shows the famed Cure of Ars at prayer. Canonized only 68 years after his death, he also is honored as the patron of young people who have difficulty in their studies. Although destined to be remembered as a model for all priests, he himself was ordained only after instructors despaired of his ever acquiring enough Latin to permit conferring major orders on him.

New Negro Priest Says Mass For Benefactors

Cincinnati—(NC)—Hundreds of Catholics turned out to witness a special Mass celebrated by a newly ordained Maryknoll missionary from California who had been "adopted" by Cincinnati school children.
 Father Leslie T. Rogers, M.M., of Hayward, Calif., the first Negro to become a Maryknoll priest, was celebrant of a High Mass in St. Joseph's Church for the parish school children who helped support him during his seminary training.

HUNDREDS of Negro Catholics and Non-Catholics packed St. Joseph's Church for the evening High Mass sung by Father Rogers.

Much credit for the event here can be given to the work of Sister Francesca, a Franciscan Sister of Oldenburg, Ind. As a young tourist, she was befriended by a Maryknoller in
