Madrid — (RNS) — Archbishop Ildebrando Antonutti, Papal Nuncio to Spain, carries the chalice reputedly used by Christ at the Last Supper and customarily referred to in Spain as the Holy Grail. It was taken from Madrid in solemn procession to the monastery church of San Juan de la Pena in the northeastern province of Huesca. In the center is Generalissimo Franco, the Spanish Chief of State and Senora Franco. The chalice was brought to Huesca on the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul.

### Arrests Follow Riot To Save Town Chapel

Krasnik Fabryczny — (RNS) — Townspeople in this southeast-Polish town, say at least 300 persons have been arrested in the wake of a pitched battle here between police and Roman Catholics June 26.

The disturbance erupted when local Red authorities ordered a Catholic chapel to be torn down. Townsfolk claim more than 1,500 persons took part in the ensuing riot but Communist authorities said no more than several hundred participated.

TADEUSZ MARK, chairman of the local National Council and secretary of the United Workers' (Communist) party, said only 20 persons were under arrest.

He said the troubles were inspired by a group of "fanatical women" who led a march on the town hall and police station after municipal officials ordered the chapel torn down on the ground that it had been built without a license.

Krasnik Fabryczny is a "new town" of 10,000 built around a metallurgical factory 15 miles from Lublin. In building the community, the Communists carefully omitted any plans for a church but an official committee of Catholics raised funds to build a chapel on the vacant lot and invited visiting priests to say Mass there.

**Funeral Mass Offered For Walter J. Duffy**

Funeral Mass for Walter J. Duffy, president of the old New York and Kentucky Co. of Rochester and a brother of James P. Duffy, K.S.G., K.M. was offered in Sacred Heart Cathedral, yesterday, July 30.

The Rev. Gerald Appleby, assistant pastor, celebrated the Mass and gave the Absolution at the grave. Bishop Kearney imparted the Blessing in the Cathedral and Auxiliary Bishop Cassey was present in the Sanctuary.

Mr. Duffy, who would have been 36 on Tuesday, died Monday, July 27, 1953 at his home, 270 Seneca Parkway.

Born July 28, 1874, Mr. Duffy received his early education in Rochester. He studied for five years at St. Mary's College in Maryland. While there he acquired a love for literature.

He was a member of old St. Patrick's Cathedral parish until the property was acquired by Eastman Kodak Co. Since then he has belonged to Sacred Heart Cathedral parish.

**THE NEW YORK and Kentucky Co. of which Mr. Duffy was president was a thriving holding company for several enterprises under a prohibition. Among their products was Duffy's Pure Malt Whiskey, advertised for medicinal use and sold only in drug stores.**

Mr. Duffy assisted in liquidation of the company affairs when the 18th amendment was passed in 1920.

Mr. Duffy married Anita A. Gilson of Rochester on Nov. 18, 1899. She died in 1945.

Surviving are four daughters, Mrs. William J. Burns, Miss Grace L. Duffy, Mrs. Francis P. White and Mrs. Thomas P. Culhane; two brothers, Hon. James P. B. Duffy, Rochester and G. Paul Duffy of Waterloo.

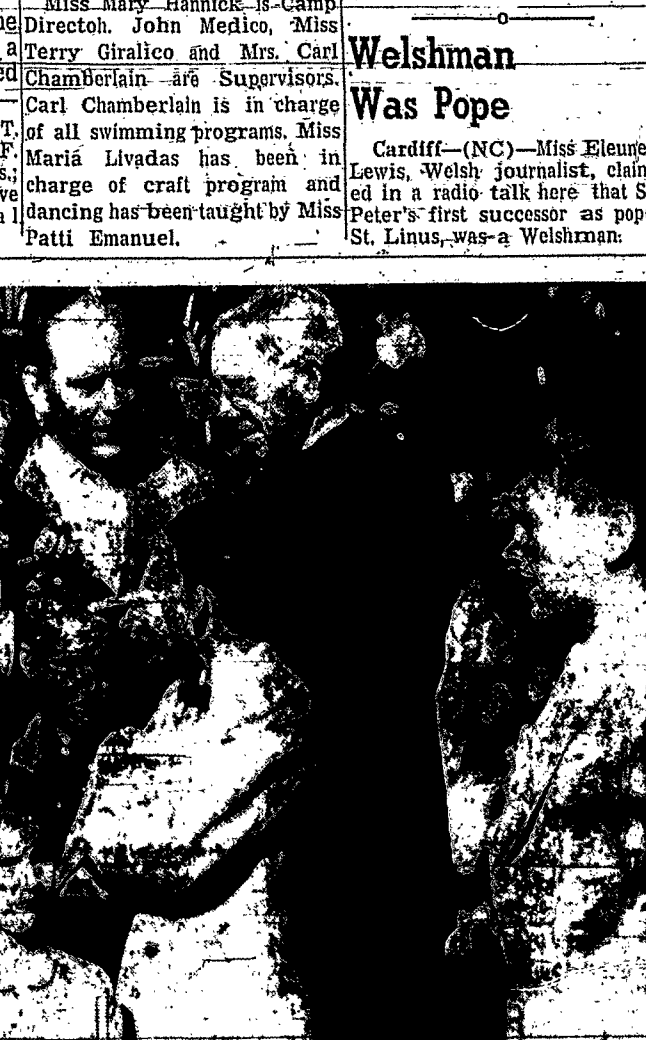

Hanover, Mass. — (RNS) — Richard Cardinal Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, will celebrate an evening Mass Aug. 1 in the tiny hilltop chapel here where he will one day be buried.

The chapel is an exact replica of the Portunucula, the ruined chapel near Assisi, Italy, given by Cluniac monks to St. Francis of Assisi, who rebuilt it and made it the birthplace of the Franciscan Order. It was here, that St. Poverello, "the little poor man," was buried.

A landmark for summer visitors to Cape Cod, the replica—hardly as big as a good-sized living room—stands on the grounds of St. Eusebius School for Handicapped Children.
