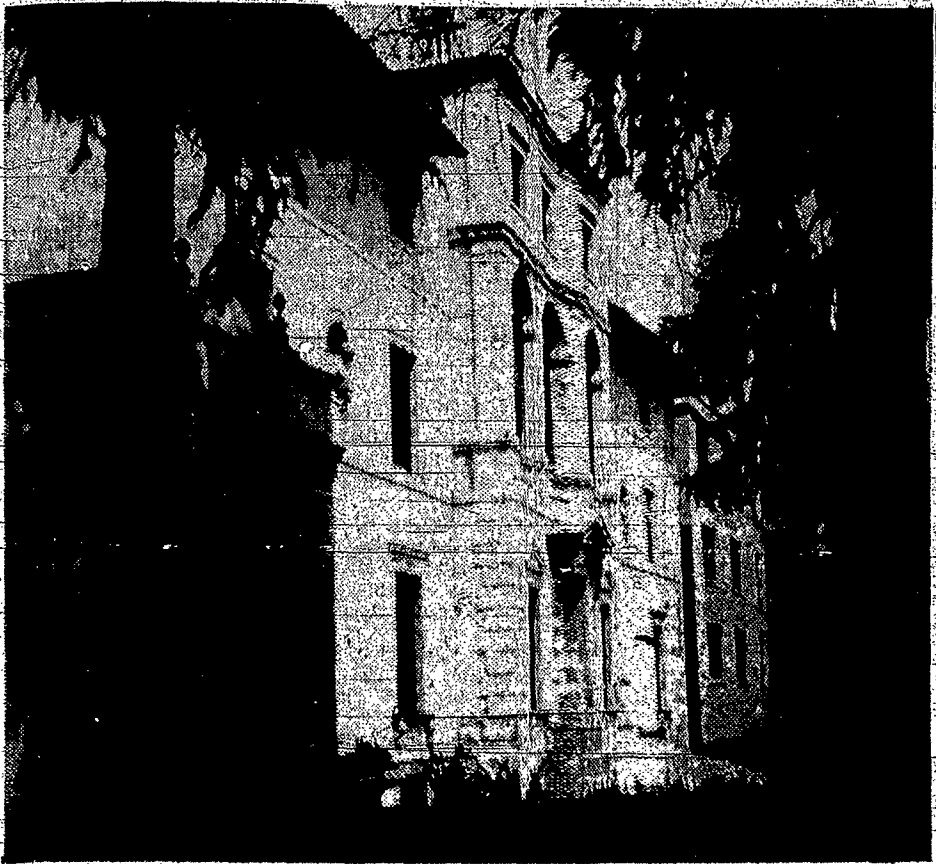


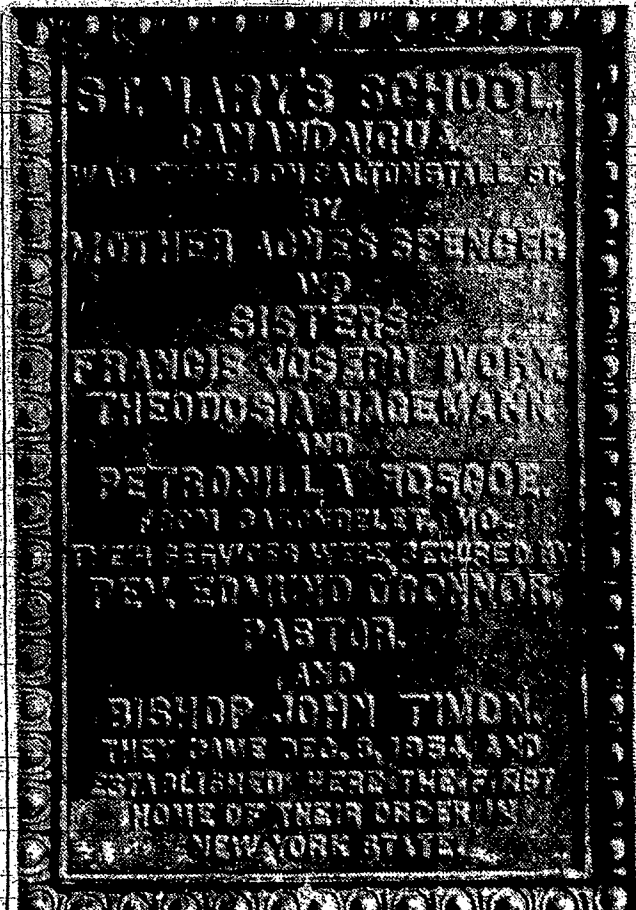
# Sunday Drive In Ontario County...

"Ontario" comes from the Iroquois word meaning "beautiful lake," and although it does not touch its namesake, Ontario County includes three very beautiful lakes—Canandaigua, Honeoye and Canadice.

The city of Canandaigua, which because of its central location was once thought of for the state capital, is located at the northern tip of the lake. Besides being a popular resort city, it is the "cradle" of the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Rochester Diocese.

On the outer wall of St. Mary's School, Canandaigua, a bronze plaque reads: "St. Mary's School, Canandaigua, was opened on Saltonstall St. by Mother Agnes Spencer and Sisters Francis Joseph Ivory, Theodosia Hagemann and Petronilla Roscoe, from Carondelet, Mo. Their services were secured by Rev. Edmund O'Connor, Pastor, and Bishop John Timon. They came Dec. 9, 1854, and established here the first home of their Order in New York State."

At the north end of Honeoye Lake is the town of Honeoye with its beautiful new church, St. Mary's dedicated recently by Bishop Kearney. Quickly outgrowing its mission status, St. Mary's is crowded on Sundays during the summer with tourist and lake-dweller.

In the easternmost part of Ontario County is the city of Geneva and Immaculate Heart of Mary Seminary under the direction of the Capuchin Fathers. Built like a Roman villa, the beautiful seminary building offers a splendid view of Seneca Lake. Its spacious lawns and gardens will soon be open to visitors when plans for a series of shrines replacing statues of pagan gods are complete.

## Paul Shannon Requiem Held

Funeral services for Paul J. Shannon, 290 Lexington Avenue, who died on July 17, 1959 while vacationing in Bantry County, Ireland, were held from the Bröderick Funeral Home, 545 Main Street West at 8:30 a.m. and from Holy Rosary Church at 9:15 a.m. on July 22.

**SOLEMN REQUIEM** Mass was celebrated by the Rev. Sidney J. Duggan, his nephew, The Rev. Charles McCarthy was deacon and the Rev. Joseph Donovan, sub-deacon. Present in the sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Monsignors Charles E. Shay, Richard K. Burns and Dennis W. Hickey. Also the Reverend Fathers Leo G. Mans, Donald Murphy, Gerard McMahon, Robert Donovan, Paul Oloonan and Patrick Dillon of the Columban Fathers.

Mr. Shannon was born in Cork, Ireland and served in World War I. He was the proprietor of a grocery store for thirty years at 197 Lexington Avenue, until his retirement in August 1958. He was a lifetime member of the Ancient Order of Hibernians of Monroe County. He was also a member of the Holy Name Society of Holy Rosary Church, the American Legion and a charter member of the Holy Rosary Post, Catholic War Veterans.

Bearers were Walter Anderson, Patrick O'Hara, Ross McMahon, Charles McCarthy, Patrick Haggerty and Anthony Beierschmitt.

**SURVIVORS** ARE his wife, Mrs. Shannon, two sisters Mrs. Margaret Brophy of Rochester and Miss Hannah Shannon of Ireland, two brothers Richard and David Shannon of Rochester, one nephew Rev. Sidney J. Duggan of England. Also several other nieces and nephews.

Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery where the final blessing was imparted by the Rev. Sidney J. Duggan assisted by Fathers Charles McCarthy, Leo Mans, Gerard McMahon, Robert Donovan and Father Dillon. Members of the Catholic War Veterans conducted the military services.

## Plea Made To Canonize Mother Seton

Emmitsburg, (NC) — An eloquent plea was made here that Pope John XXIII "may see through to fulfillment" a petition for the canonization of Mother Elizabeth Bayley Seton, Msgr. John Price Ellis, professor of Church History at the Catholic University of America, made the appeal at the ceremonies marking the sesquicentennial of St. Joseph's Convent and College here.

**MOTHER SETON** founded the U.S. Sisters of Charity at Emmitsburg with eight followers. The community founded by her was the first native American sisterhood. If she is canonized, she will be the first native American to be so honored.

Msgr. Ellis pointed out that the original tiny foundation has grown into six communities with almost 10,000 professed religious in the United States and Canada. He added:

"Nothing but an extraordinary love of God could have brought about this magnificent achievement for the Church in our times. And I like to think that it represents the flowering in your midst of the kind of love and reverence that Elizabeth Seton manifested for God from her earliest childhood."

## Formosa Missions

### Seminary For China

Tripoli (NC) — Archbishop Antonio Riberi, newly appointed Apostolic Nuncio to Ireland, said here in a farewell address that Formosa "must be the seminary of the mainland" of China.

Archbishop Riberi who served for 13 years as Apostolic Nuncio in China, spoke of a farewell gathering of bishops and priests.

He said he is sad because of the situation on the mainland, held by the Communists, but added that he is "full of joy for the wonderful development which God has bestowed on Formosa."

"Never in the long history of the Chinese missions has such rapid progress taken place," he said.

He referred to the missionary progress on Formosa in recent years. Since the Archbishop's arrival in 1952, Catholics on the island have increased from some 20,000 to the present estimated 170,000, and the number of priests has risen from less than 100 to well over 500.

Numerous Catholic institutions have been erected, including four minor seminaries.

"Speaking of the future of the missions in China, the Archbishop said: 'We do not know what may happen... we can be sure... that at least our successors... will return.'"

As his last wish, the Archbishop expressed to the Bishops and priests his hope for an increase in native vocations. "I mean in Formosa, of course, but I also think of the mainland," he stated. "You must prepare the clergy of the future. This island must be the seminary of the mainland."

Archbishop Riberi will be succeeded in his post in Formosa by Msgr. Giuseppe Caprio, who has served as Regent of the Apostolic Delegation in Cochina for southern Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos.

## Father Nolan Honored By Community Chest

Geneva — At the annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the Geneva Community Chest held Tuesday, July 21, the Rev. Raymond P. Nolan, pastor of St. Stephen's Church, was made an honorary board member, with full voting power.

He is the fifth person, and the first clergyman, ever so honored.

**FATHER NOLAN** was recognized for his "devoted and continuing interest and service in all phases of Chest operation."

Father Nolan has served as director, chairman of the Budget Committee, General Campaign Chairman, and President over a period of more than fifteen years.

Other Genevans who have been named honorary members are Mrs. Ronald M. Harman, who was chosen last year, and the late Harry E. Hovey, Alfred G. Lewis, Sr., and Edward J. Cook, chosen years ago.
