More than 500 relatives and friends attended the 43rd annual commencement exercises of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing held at St. Peter and Paul's Church on Sunday afternoon, August 2 at 4 p.m.

The class of twenty-seven members formed a procession at the Nurses' Residence, and proceeded to the church with the student body acting as a guard of honor. Altar boys of St. Peter and Paul's Church served as cross bearers and acolytes.

A COLOR GUARD of Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus led the procession. The graduates wore corsages of pink roses, gift of the Medical Staff of the Hospital.

The class was presented to Bishop Kearney by Rev. Philip E. Mohan, hospital chaplain, who congratulated the graduates and their parents. Diplomas, pins and honors were awarded by the Bishop, who presided at the exercises.

The exercises were concluded with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered by the Bishop assisted by Very Rev. Msgr. Edward J. McAniff and Father Mc Ghan. At the close of the Mass, the Bishop addressed the class.

"Remember that you are choosing a vocation where you will be dealing with the sick, the Christlike in your patience and forbearance. Sickness sees us at our worst—the human mind is not itself, so be patient," the Bishop said.

"You just recited the pledge in which you promised to see Christ in His suffering ones. Remember this pledge always.

"If your patient who closes his eyes and feels your hand on his fevered brow, thinks it is the hand of his Mother, you are a great nurse," he concluded.

The choir was made up of student nurses with Miss Florence Hughes at the organ.

FOLLOWING THE exercises in the Church, a dinner for the graduates was held in the Dunn Memorial Nurses' Residence. Bishop Kearney was guest of honor at the dinner. ## New Windows 41 Nun-Students To Be Blessed Granted Degrees At Monastery

Rev. Damasus Winsen, O.S.B., prior, will bless the new stained glass windows in Our Lady, Queen of Peace Chapel at Mount Saviour Monastery on Sunday, Aug. 9, following vespers at 4:30 p.m.

The new windows are the gift of Miss Mary Mann of Elmira in memory of Gertrude Holleran.

NORMAN DALY, Professor of Art at Cornell University was chosen to design the windows. Daly has achieved both national and international success in his field.

He has exhibited at the Carnegie and the Chicago Art Institutes at the Whitney and the Metropolitan Art Museums, and at the Corcoran Gallery. He spent some time lecturing in France and Italy for the Parsons School of Design. His own art exhibits in New York City received outstanding reviews.

Professor Daly's design was executed by Lynn Gibbs, well known glass craftsman of Elmira.

THE GENERAL theme of the whole series of windows is the mystery of time. Four sets of windows develop this theme, focusing in turn on day, week, year and lifetime of a monk.

The glass, imported from England, France, and Germany, is placed in the frames in large pieces and is not cut in the traditional mosaic pattern.

Monks are planning today of the Chapel during Dedication Day on Aug. 16, as well as this Sunday. They will explain many of the specific symbols of Professor Daly's designs. The public is welcome at any time.

# 30 New Shrines To Adorn Grounds

Geneva — A shrine in honor of Our Lady of Fatima and about 30 other statues are being built on the grounds of the Capuchin Seminary, Lochland Rd.

Work on the long-planned project began about two weeks ago and is scheduled to be completed in October. Dedication ceremonies will be held then.

THE STATIONS of the Cross is included in the total of 11 shrines under construction on the south side of the seminary property.

An entry road to the shrine area has been started on the south side and will encircle the property. A large parking area will be provided.

Various area business men have donated labor, materials, and machinery for the project. Other contributions will go for the purchase of statues.

THE CAPUCHIN fathers expect the shrine project "to be of benefit to the entire community, morally, spiritually and socially."

The area will be open to the public. Spotlights will be provided so that the shrines will be visible at night.

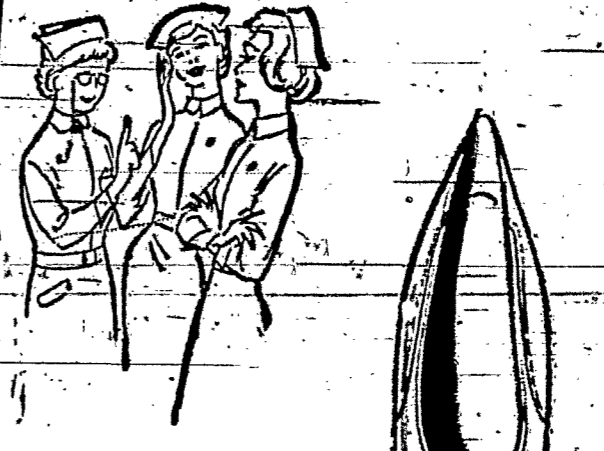

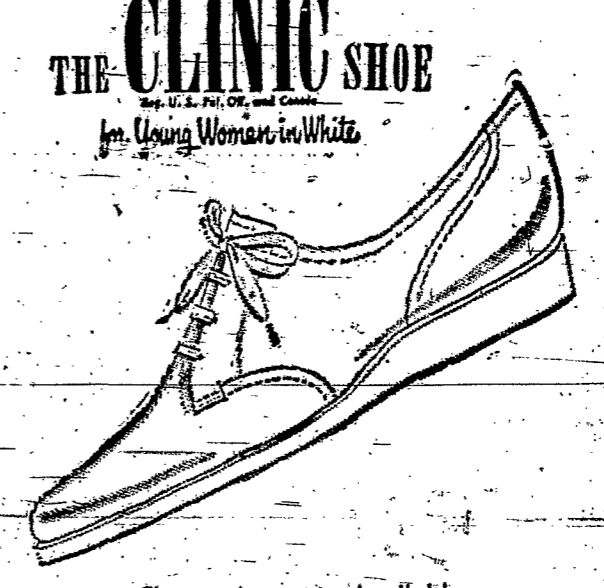
