Watching The Screen 'Sparkling Nickel'

The "technicolor biography of jazz musician Red Nichols again proves the amazing acting ability of Popular Denny Kaye in "THE FIVE PENNIES" at the Paramount Theater for "THE WHOLE FAMILY."

The story follows a familiar route. Musician wants to play a new kind of music. Musical bigshots won't let him play it. So he organizes his own group. New music is sook. It's all true but the problem in this type of story is to make it interesting. This has been done very well in this wholesome clip of film from Paramount.

THE PRODUCTION gets a sparkle and vitality with comedy routines for Kaye that are funny in their own right. He has able sidemen, too, in both the film and musical sense. Besides Louis Armstrong (playing himself) there are Ray Anthony (Jimmy Dorsey), Bobbie Troup (Artie Schutt), Shelley Manne (Dave Tough), Ray Daley (Glenn Miller), and Bob Crosby as a prototype of the 20's pup bandleader, complete with megaphone, the schmitt, and the limp beat.

Playing opposite Kaye is lovely Barbara Bell Geddes who, as his wife, belies the character's chorus girl origins and makes quiet portrait of a woman never swerving from her dedication to her husband and daughter. By her resting Miss Bell Geddes gives her role dignity and importance. Young Susan Gordon is a standout as Kaye's daughter in early years, and Tuesday Weld is attractive as the same girl in her teens.

RED NICHOLS himself is heard in Kaye's trumpet solos and several fine new songs will be whistled as you leave this 117-minute warm family movie.

It's difficult to select the brightest facet of such a brightly-studied movie. You'll just have to decide by seeing it at the Paramount Theater.

Newmanites To Honor 1st Chaplain

Washington—(NC)—The National Newman Club Federation will present its highest honor, the John Henry Cardinal Newman Award, to the priest who was the pioneer Newman Club Chaplain, Msgr. John W. Keogh, now a Philadelphia pastor.

MSGR. KEOGH became the first Newman club chaplain when appointed by Cardinal Dennis Dougherty of Philadelphia on September 22, 1913, to assume full time duties as chaplain to Catholic students at the University of Pennsylvania and as rector of St. Bede's Chapel.

The original Newman Club had been established at the university in 1893 by five medical students. Until Msgr. Keogh's coming, they had been assisted by part-time spiritual advisers.

For 25 years, Msgr. Keogh ministered to the spiritual and intellectual needs of students at the University of Pennsylvania, directed their campuses and dioceses and was instrumental in bringing about the National Federation of Newman Clubs which now counts some 500 member organizations.

Book Binder's Art
 The Book Binder's Art is reflected in a special exhibition at Rochester Museum of Art and Science. There are fifteen books in the collection. Each one is distinctive in itself. All in different design, they are of rare beauty, delicately painted and inlaid in gold. The exhibit was arranged by the Women's Council of the Rochester Museum Association under the chairmanship of Mrs. Allen Macomber. It will remain on view through October.

Rome Tribunal Refuses Nullification

Rome—(NC)—Rome's diocesan court has refused to declare null the Church marriage of Carlo Ponti, movie director, and Giuliana Elvira Ponti. He has entered a civil marriage with actress Sophia Loren.

On appeal, the case would be reviewed by the ecclesiastical court of appeals, and could then go before the Sacred Roman Rota, a supreme court of the Church.

Mrs. Ponti's case had been pending for 18 months before the diocesan court handed down its decision.

Mr. Ponti obtained a Mexican divorce in August, 1957, and he and Miss Loren had a proxy civil marriage in Mexico a month later.

Mr. Ponti and Miss Loren face the prospect of bigamy charges in Italy unless Mr. Ponti's Church marriage is declared null by ecclesiastical authority.
