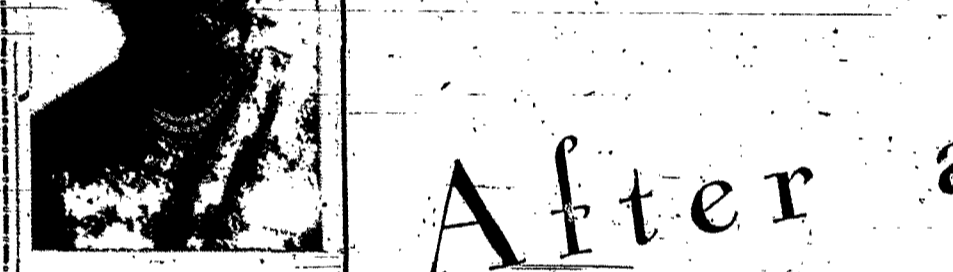
THE AFFAIR will be held on St. Michael's Church, "the little white church on the hill" grounds.
