After finishing his elementary education at St. Francis de Sales, Geneva, Mr. Lynch attended high school and finished two years of classical studies at Holy Ghost Missionary College, Cornwallis Hills, Pa.

HE ENTERED the novitiate last August. Following profession he will be sent to St. Mary's Seminary, Newark, Conn. to complete his ecclesiastical studies prior to ordination.

As a Holy Ghost Father, Mr. Lynch will work either in this country, Puerto Rico, or Africa. His congregation, a world-wide missionary society with over 1400 members laboring in Africa, is primarily noted in this country for its Negro and educational work.

Mass For 'Church In Distress'

Koenigstein/Taunus, Germany. — An Eastern Rite Mass for persecuted Catholics behind the Iron Curtain is celebrated here by Archbishop John Bueko, Apostolic Visitor to Ruthenian Rite Catholics in Western Europe. The liturgy was held during the ninth annual "Church in Distress" congress devoted to the plight of the persecuted faithful. In a message Pope John XXIII said he was praying for the congress, which was attended by some 600 delegates from 30 countries, including many under Nazi rule. The congress theme was "The Truth and Its Falsification Through Communism." It was sponsored by the Koenigstein Institute, a center for the spiritual and physical care of displaced persons from the East living in West Germany.
