

Mountain Climbing Missionaries Explore Native Family Customs

Alexisbaai — (RNS) — Two Divine Word missionaries celebrated Mass atop 15,400-foot Mount Wilhelm, the highest peak in the territory of Papua and New Guinea.

They are Father Bernard Johnson and Father Raphael M. Witten, head of the Waruk Mission and historian of the Alexisbaai Vicariate, respectively.

The expedition to the mountain top was started by Father Witten who wanted to examine the route into the densely populated highlands discovered by pioneer Divine Word missionaries in 1923 and 1928.

He left on his estimated 220-mile trek from Alexisbaai at the Waruk Mission, he was joined by Father Johnson who organized the rest of the expedition.

The route led up and down steep mountains, through groves of twisted bamboo and moss-laden trees, across rotting log and slippery rocks, sometimes through rain and mud. A twisting river was forded 14 times in an afternoon. One whole day the priests were plagued by leeches. And about 350 feet from the top of Mount Wilhelm they ran into snow.

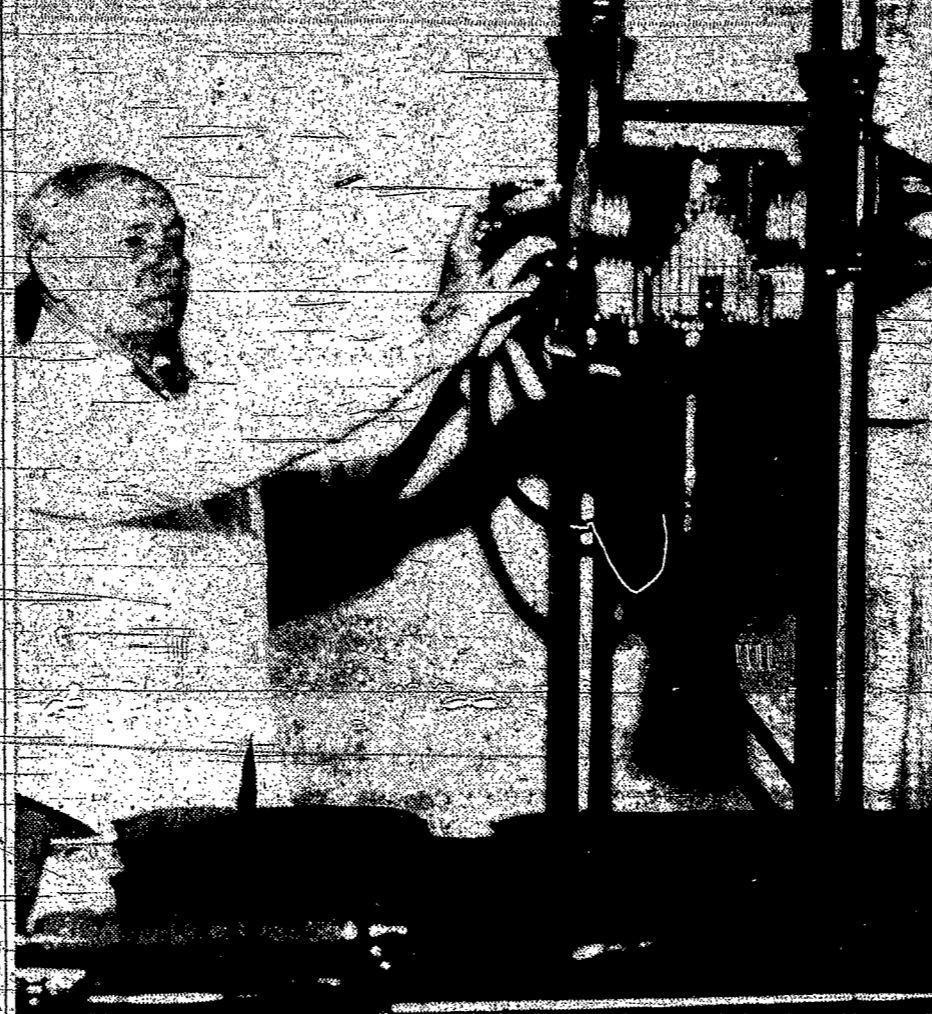
On the way up they came across a new type of family life at Keglugi, at the head of the Chimbu Valley. In other areas they had found husbands and wives living with their children in the same house.

In the Chimbu Valley husbands were banded together in groups of two or three and lived in one house with their sons near the foot of a mountain. Higher up the mountain side, the wives, each in a house of her own lived with unmarried daughters.

From the wreckage of a U.S. Air Force bomber, relic of World War II, the two priests

retrieved aluminum tubing and copper wire with which they made a large cross and placed it in a niche at the top of Mount Wilhelm, above a table of rock which they used as altar. Their Chimbu guide, Barabas Demkama, left behind a large flag on a 15-foot pole for passing planes to see.

The priests were flown back to the coast in a small mission plane covering the distance in 85 minutes which on foot took them 11 days.

Sergeant Friday was cited for being "instrumental in establishing one of the most efficient units within the Base Supply Structure".

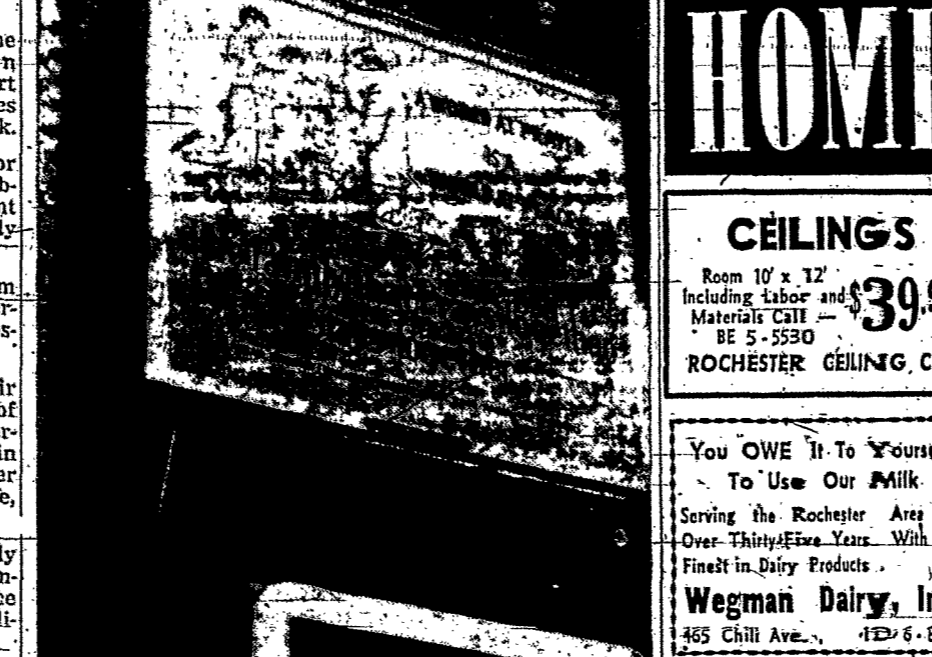
In June he returned from Spain while his father underwent surgery at St. Mary's Hospital.
