

'Cultural Achievements Can Strengthen Church'

Notre Dame, Ind.—(NC)—The spiritual mission of the Church is strengthened by her cultural achievements in the drama and fine arts, a Bishop told the 12th biennial convention of the National Catholic Conference here.

Coadjutor Bishop Thomas J. McDonnell of Wheeling, W. Va., said that the theatre, which has a special attraction for young people, can be a field of Catholic action for them.

CITING "an increasing indifference to God and religion" as well as immorality and decency in literature, dress and entertainment, Bishop McDonnell called on Catholic young people to make their influence felt in the theatrical world.

The West Virginian prelate delivered the sermon at a Pontifical Mass offered in the University of Notre Dame's Sacred Heart Church by Bishop Leo A. Pursley of Fort Wayne, host of the convention.

Rites Held For Drama Teacher

Funeral Mass for Eugene E. McCarthy, LeMoyne College Drama Head and Assistant Professor of English since 1948 were held in St. Patrick Church, Albany, August 29.

Mr. McCarthy, 63, a brother of Mrs. A. L. Tomanyovich of Rochester, died August 18, 1959 in Albany, Ill for a long time he was spending the summer with his brother, Gerald.

A charter member of the LeMoyne College Guild in Syracuse, he was director of the Guild's Players. He was director of the Boot and Buskin, dramatics society of the college, and under his guidance many outstanding Broadway plays were presented.

AN AUTHORITY on Shakespeare, Mr. McCarthy directed his players in a number of Shakesperian productions which resulted in wide interest in college dramatic groups throughout the State.

Born at Williamsport, Pa. and educated at Woodstock College, Maryland, he resided in Albany until going to LeMoyne. He taught in Albany High Schools and was continuously associated with local dramatic groups. He organized and was director of the Blackfriars Guild in Albany.

Mr. McCarthy, whose wife died in January, is survived by three other brothers, all in the Albany area.

'False Witness' Set On Marian Theater

Boston Archdiocese Gets Theater For Films, Meets

Situated on Massachusetts Avenue near Symphony Hall here, the acquired theater, Loew's State, seats 3,583. It was built in 1922 by the late Marcus Loew at a cost of \$2,000,000.

First archdiocesan event in the theater will be the showing of a color film, "The 15 Mysteries of the Rosary," which was made in Spain under the supervision of the Rev. Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., director of the Family Rosary Crusade.

Fantasy And Horror

By RAY SMITH People of all sizes will get a bang out of "DARBY O'GILL AND THE LITTLE PEOPLE" at the Monroe Theater for the WHOLE FAMILY. Again, the magic name of Walt Disney presents a rollicking fantasy in the same style that has made him the friend of children of all ages for many years. It might be well to note that Disney's reputation for good clean movies has never been challenged. Hollywood, look and count (if you have the time) at the money he has made with such family entertainment. Oh well, some will never learn.

Everything revolves around Albert Sharpe's (Darby) pucky escapades with the 21-inch-tall portion of Ireland's population. Along the way there's a good deal of heated, but healthy romance, a brilliant fist-fight, and a climactic dose of genuine horror that should bare a lot of moppet eyeballs and work a shiver or two up the spine of mummies and daddies. Kiddies, teenagers, adults, and oldsters will find something to get excited about.

SHARPE'S VISIT to leprechaun headquarters offers the film's most scintillating moments. It is a sequence in which the painstaking production is most in evidence, from the gaily-bounding dance of the diminutive creatures (accomplished, it is understood, via

trampolines) to the striking goldshaded color photography.

Sharpe's performance is a gem. He benefits from the combination of being lovable, yet humanly frail and prone to greed and pride but embellishes the role with a refreshingly individual manner of expression that should endear him. Similar excellence is achieved by O'Dea as the dangerous but rather good-looking king.

A potential scare spot, however, is the language barrier of foreign speech inflections. It will give children considerable difficulty and even adults will have to cock their ears to catch all the words, particularly those of Estelle Winwood.

All in all, Disney does it again and it's good viewing for 65 minutes for the family.

'Murder In Cathedral' Opera Listed

New York—(NC)—Plans are underway to bring an operatic version of T. S. Elliot's play "Murder in the Cathedral" to dioceses throughout North America.

This was announced by Frank Forest and Walter V. Anderson, co-producers of the opera which tells the story of the martyrdom of St. Thomas a Becket, 12th century Archbishop of Canterbury, England.

The opera, written by Italian composer Idebrando Pizzetti, will have its New England premiere Sept. 25 when it is given an unprecedented staging in Boston's Holy Cross cathedral.

THE WORK had its world premiere at the La Scala opera house in Milan, Italy, on March 1, 1958. It has been nicknamed "the Pope's opera" because of a command performance given earlier this year for His Holiness Pope John XXIII.

St. Thomas a Becket was assassinated on December 29, 1170, by four knights of King Henry II of England because he refused to bow to unjust demands by the King.

Heading the cast as the Archbishop is Plinio Clabassi, a member of the La Scala company. A featured member of the cast is Theresa Stratas, of the Metropolitan Opera company, New York.

THE OPERA has been produced in nearly a score of cities in Europe. The American premiere was given on Sept. 17, 1958, at Carnegie Hall here. It has since had other U.S. productions.
