

Dutch Deacon To Speak On Church Architecture

Notre Dame—(NC)—A Dutch deacon of the Byzantine Rite will take a major part in the North American Liturgical Week, which will be held here from August 23 to 27 under the patronage of Bishop Leo A. Pursley of Fort Wayne.

He is the Rev. Dr. Cornelius A. Rouman, who teaches liturgy at the Catholic University of Nijmegen, the Netherlands, and for the past five summers has taught courses in the liturgy here at the University of Notre Dame.

DEACON ROUMAN will address a church architecture study group on how church structure and participation in the Mass were related in the early and medieval church. He will also address the Institute on Sacramental Theology, being held in conjunction with the Liturgical Week, on "The Eucharistic Prayer as a Prayer of Praise."

He was ordained a deacon in the Byzantine Rite in the Russian Church of St. Anthony in Rome in 1955, to serve in the parish churches of that rite in the Netherlands. He received his doctorate from the State University of Utrecht, the Netherlands.

His works include a Dutch-Latin translation of the missal, a study of the early ritual of the anointing of Christian kings and emperors and its place in the liturgy of that period, and a book on the liturgical veneration of the Mother of God in the Eastern Churches.

Nun Works In No Sister Land

Doubt, antagonism and fear gripped the people in Spruce Pine, N. C. last summer as they saw a Catholic nun for the first time. "They took us for gypsies at first," said Sister Mary Christine, a native Rochesterian, who is spending a week's vacation with her family here.

A member of the Glenmary Home Mission Sisters, Sister Christine made her first trip to "No Sister Land" last summer. The order of nuns was started in 1941 and received its approval in 1952. The sisters work in rural sections of the United States where there are few or no Catholics.

Sister Christine entered the order after graduating from Nazareth Academy in 1956. The World Mission Scenerama held in October, 1955 in Rochester first introduced her to the Glenmary Sisters.

She took her first vows in May of 1958 and will receive her final vows in 1963. The relatively new order has only 78 professed nuns and 10 novices.

Two Priests Victims Of China Reds

Hong Kong—(NC)—Word has reached here of the arrest of one Chinese priest by the Reds and the death of another in prison.

Reports state that Father Joseph Chen Tsiang-jan of the Swatow diocese has been sentenced to a term of hard labor. It is not known whether the Reds accused him of "crime" or whether they decided he needed "re-education through work."

Meanwhile newly arrived refugees have brought reports of the death in jail of Father Joseph Tsang Kei-yun of the Kongsmoon diocese.

Arrested by the communists for the first time in 1953, he was later released. He was re-arrested in 1952 and sent to a forced labor camp. Then he was sent to another prison camp on the Tibetan border.

Buddhists Seek Ouster Of Sisters

Colombo, Ceylon—(RNS)—Establishment of Buddhist schools to train nurses who would replace Roman Catholic nuns now staffing state-operated hospitals in Ceylon was urged by the International Buddhist Conference here.

A resolution adopted by the conference declared that Buddhist and not Catholic nurses should work in public hospitals of this predominantly Buddhist country.

The conference, sponsored by the World Congress of Buddhist Women, was attended by delegates from India, Italy and England, as well as from Ceylon.

Last March the Ceylon Cabinet, in view of the shortage of nurses in the nation, evoked a decree which would have forced Catholic nursing sisters to quit their posts in state hospitals. The government's ruling permitted the nuns to remain on the hospitals staffs for the next five years when the issue will be considered again.

Leftists Win Sicily Vote

Palermo—(NC)—Silvio Milazzo's Christian Social party, with the help of communists and socialists, has won complete control of the government of the semi-autonomous island of Sicily.

Twelve assessors—the name given to regional government ministers—have been elected by the Sicilian Regional Assembly.

None of them represent the previously dominant Christian Democrats or their allies. At the same time, no Communist or Socialist party members were elected, but this was because of an agreement between Milazzo and his political allies.

Milazzo's victory gives the communists and left-wing socialists—who have had little political voice in Italy in the past—a strong position in influencing the government of an independent party by being able to throw their votes to an opponent of the Christian Democrats.

Milazzo, who broke with the Catholic-oriented Christian Democratic party last winter, was elected head of Sicily's regional government late last month.

He has been criticized consistently for accepting help from communists and socialists. The criticism included editorial in L'Osservatore Romano, Vatican City daily, which recalled the

Holy See's decree warning Catholics against voting for candidates of non-communist parties who collaborate with the Reds.
