

Lawyers' Annual Red Mass To Mark Opening Of Courts

Bishop Kearney will celebrate the annual Lawyers' Red Mass and preach the sermon, Wednesday, Sept. 16 at St. Joseph's Church, Franklin St., Rochester.

General chairman for the 14th annual Mass, which marks the opening of the courts of justice in Rochester and the Seventh Judicial District is the Honorable Daniel J. O'Mara, Supreme Court Justice.

Inaugurated by Bishop Kearney in 1945, the Red Mass has been celebrated since medieval times in most European countries at the opening of new court terms to invoke the blessing of the Holy Spirit on the courts of justice. The Mass takes its name from the color of the vestments worn by the celebrant.

Bishop Casey To Launch Waterloo Parish Drive

A WELCOME from Sister Rose Angela, dean of the college, and from student association officers will open the program. Opportunity will be provided for the incoming Freshmen to meet their faculty counselors, their Big Sisters, and members of the faculty.

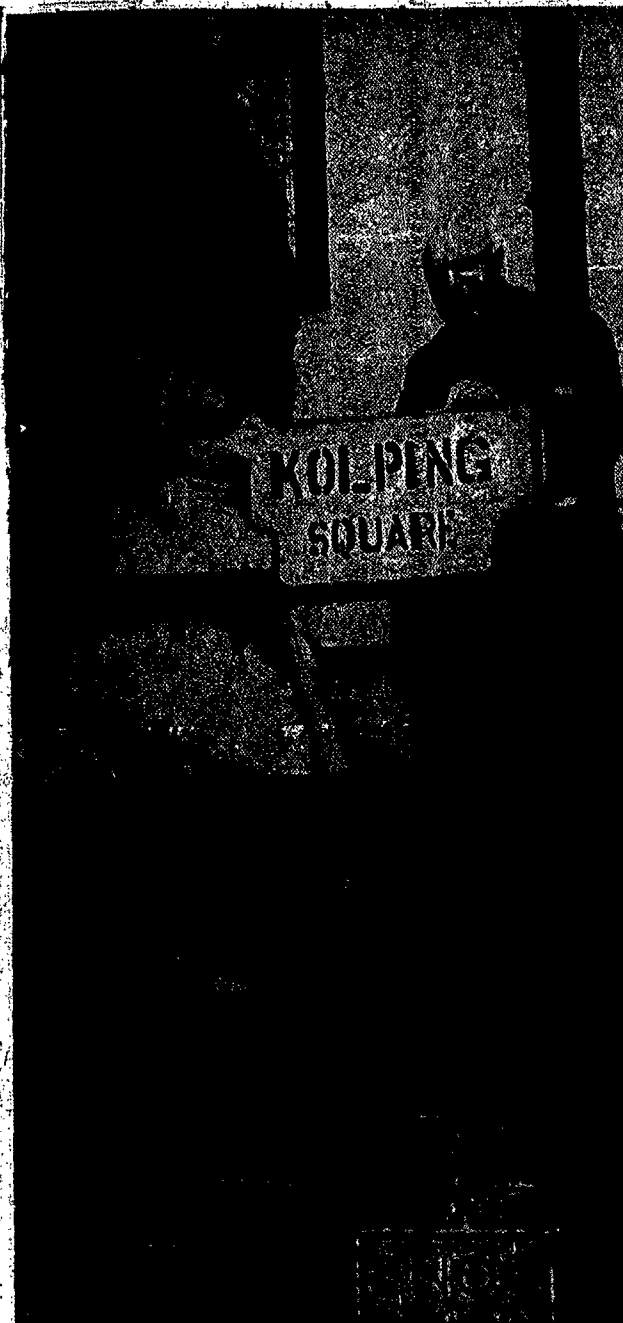
