St. Anne Trip Taken By 96

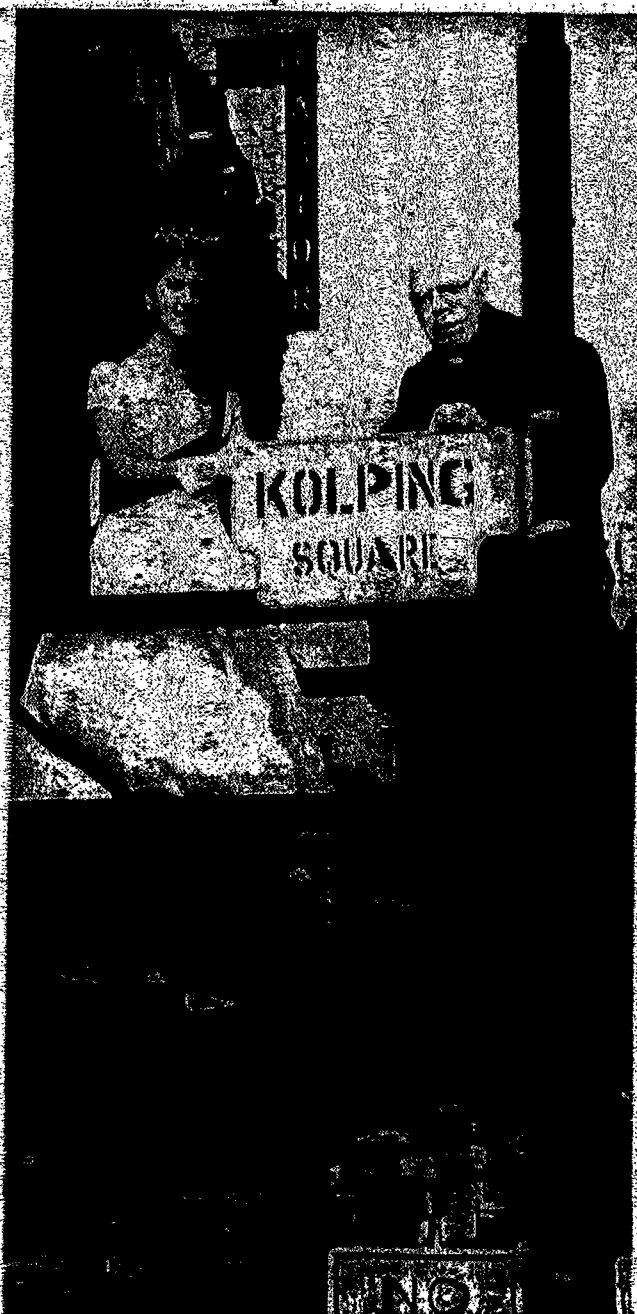

Bishop Casey To Launch Waterloo Parish Drive

Waterloo — Auxiliary Bishop Casey will address more than 200 fund campaign committeemen of St. Mary's Church at their kickoff dinner at 6 p.m., Saturday, Sept. 12, in the American Legion Home.

General solicitation of parishioners is slated from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. Sunday for pledges toward expansion of St. Mary's School and construction of an auditorium - gymnasium - cafeteria.

The Rev. James E. O'Connell, pastor, said the maximum goal is \$135,000 in three-year pledges. This approximates a year more than half of the project's estimated costs. Completion is expected by September, 1960.

Monsignor Edward K. Ball, Geneva pastor and dean of area Catholic churches, told the fund-drive workers, "The first duty of the Church is the salvation of souls."

"Part of the Church's necessary work is the education of its young members for eternity. Educators for time only fail to train the whole man who has an immortal soul," he said.

MONSIGNOR BALL termed the campaign members "immortal builders" because their work makes possible the building of needed additional classrooms where young minds and souls will be given a "total training for this life and the next."

Prayers for the success of the appeal will be offered by parishioners at 7 p.m. Friday, Sept. 11, at an outdoor shrine on the church grounds. Devotions will include a procession of school children, recitation of the Rosary, hymns and Benediction.

FATHER O'CONNELL laid plans call for erection of a building unit to be connected by corridor to the present 50-year-old four-classroom school. It will contain four more classrooms, principal's office, nurse's room, two meeting rooms and an "all-purpose" auditorium which will seat 340 persons.

Rising school applications necessitate more space, the pastor pointed out. Need for a hall is highlighted by the fact that parishioners now must conduct meetings in classrooms and social functions in community hall.

Heading the general committee for the school and hall appeal are Walter J. Brainerd, jump.

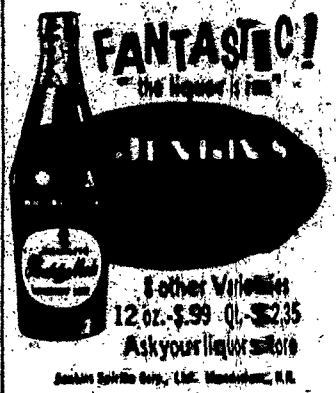
"It's a splendid all-around book," he added.

Teachers' Math Course Offered At Nazareth
A State-sponsored program in Mathematics for elementary school teachers will be offered at Nazareth College of Rochester during the 1959-1960 academic year. The course will be offered on Saturday mornings, 10 to 11:50, beyond the 1959-1960 academic year.
A limited number of scholarships will be available to qualified applicants. Stipends will cover tuition and fees, \$40 each semester, plus allowance for transportation, \$25 each semester.
Purpose of the program is to serve as a refresher course and to familiarize teachers with modern mathematical concepts which can and should be introduced into the basic curriculum of the elementary school. Included in the program will be regularly scheduled demonstration classes with children at various grade levels. Two credits each semester, graduate or undergraduate, may be earned.
APPLICANTS MUST have the qualifications necessary for certification and must have been regularly assigned elementary school teachers during the 1958-1959 academic year. They must also indicate their intention of continuing their employment as elementary teachers in New York State before the 1959-1960 academic year.
Application forms may be obtained from the Chairman of the Mathematics Department, Nazareth College of Rochester, 4245 East Avenue, Rochester, 10, New York.
Qualified applicants who do not earn awards may attend by paying tuition.
