Missionary Film Series Slated For WVET-TV

Produced by the Rev. Charles Erb, S.V.D., native of Rochester and manager of the Mission Scenerama held at the War Memorial, a series of Divine Word Presentations-in color will be seen on WVET-TV, Channel 10 on four successive Saturdays beginning Oct. 3 at 2 p.m.

The half-hour series will open with "Letters from India," a travelogue-type show with continuous action and background. Rev. Gerard Hofstee, of Mt. Vernon, Washington, who has spent almost a quarter of a century in the Divine Word Mission of Indore, India, writes to his friend, Val Bettin who is editor of the priest in India.

THE NEXT presentation on October 10 at 2 p.m. will be an Indonesian Passion Play. This is a play-within-a-play type show. Sister Franciska, Holy Ghost nun who tells sixth-graders about the Indonesians, their pagan and Christian art and work of missionaries among them is a veteran missionary. She unrolls for the children the Indonesian Passion Play acted by Oberammergau-wise Indonesians who perform it simply and reverently.

On October 17 at 2 p.m., the film in color will be entitled "Anthropos" and will depict Dr. William Schmidt, S.V.D., world famous anthropologist and linguist. This shows how scientists can be an approach and aid to missionary work. Included will be Dr. Ralph Wiltgen, S.V.D., misanthropologist from Chicago presenting Dr. Schmidt's activities. Dr. Martin Guadalupe, who has done outstanding research work among the pigmy tribes of the world and among Indian tribes of North and South America and scenes in the laboratory of Dr. Louis Lubetkin, who tells of work among the headhunters of New Guinea.

THE FINAL FILM on October 24 will present SVD Jagan Dr. Anthony Zimmerman SVD with 10 years experience in Japan tells a dramatic story of the Church's attempt to bring Christianity to Japan.

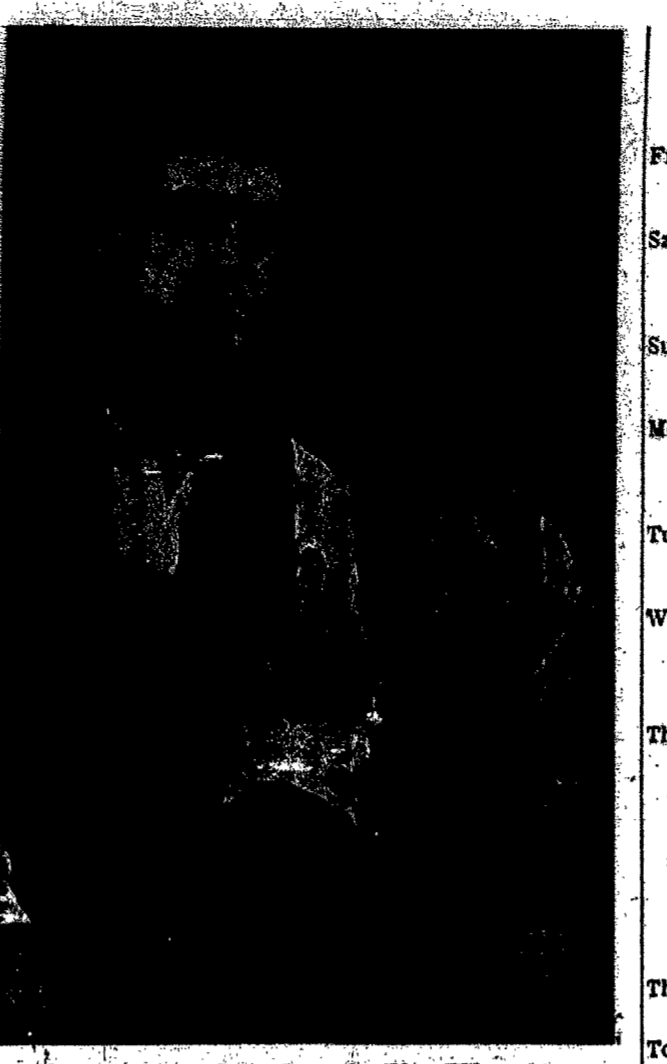

Turntable Talk . . .

Beethoven

Beethoven: Violin Concerto in D, Op. 61. Helfferich, Boston Symphony Orchestra (Victor stereo LSC 1962, monaural IM 1962).

Whatever else your classical collection may lack, it should have at least one version of the Beethoven Violin Concerto. Here is music that speaks to you directly on the first hearing. It is an approach and aid to missionary work.

Beethoven: Symphony No. 5 in C minor, Op. 67. Columbia Symphony Orchestra, Bruno Walter conducting (Columbia stereo MS 6035, monaural M L 1365).

Walter's re-recording of the Beethoven symphonies is one of the best of Beethoven's many fine slow movements, and Walter's treatment of it is masterful. The combination of the two symphonies in one disc makes this an unusually attractive record.

Beethoven: Triple Concerto in C, Op. 58. David Oistrakh, violin; Sviatoslav Knushevitzky, cello; Lev Oberlin, piano; Philharmonia Orchestra, Sir Malcolm Sargent conducting. (Angel stereo and monaural, 85067).

If you think of music only as something that can be whistled, Beethoven's triple concerto will probably not give you complete satisfaction. But if you delight in intricacies of texture, delicate balance and rich development of thematic material, you will find these qualities abundantly in this unique work.

The David Oistrakh Trio has made a sort of specialty of the triple concerto, with competing versions of it on three distinct labels. They play it with a fine sense of ensemble and virtuoso quality from all three soloists.

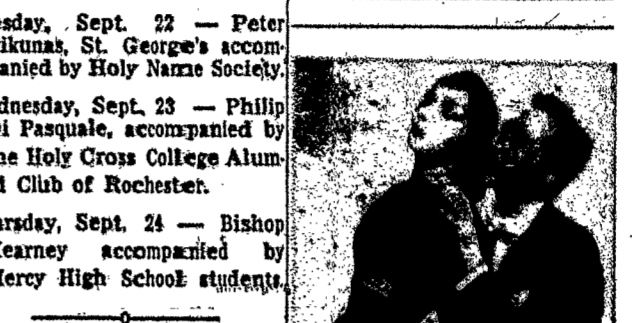
The spotlight falls naturally on the violinist, but he shares it generously with his two very competent colleagues. The Philharmonia Orchestra and Sir Malcolm Sargent do their part solidly but do not try to intrude on the soloist's conception of the work. Angel's stereo sound is excellent.
