

Joe Aleo Holds Record In Bowling

Joe Aleo, secretary of the Catholic Men's Bowling League holds the unofficial world record for marathon bowling. He accomplished this at Circle Bowling Lane, Trenton, N.J., by bowling 118 hours and 10 minutes of actual bowling with 812 consecutive games bowled.

PREVIOUS MARK was bowled by Walter Bruno of Miami with 598 games in a row Nov. 25-30, 1958. Under the unwritten marathon rules, player is allowed time out for nourishment, a rubdown, etc., but no actual sleep.

Aleo who resides with his wife and two sons at 187 Fulton Ave., Rochester (he has a third son in the Navy) weighed 160 pounds before beginning the marathon. When he finished he had lost only 11 pounds.

A 175-average bowler who competed in five Rochester leagues last season, Aleo averaged slightly over 138 for his 812-game grind.

John Seaman, Aleo's cousin and manager of the Circle Bowling Lanes acted as his manager.

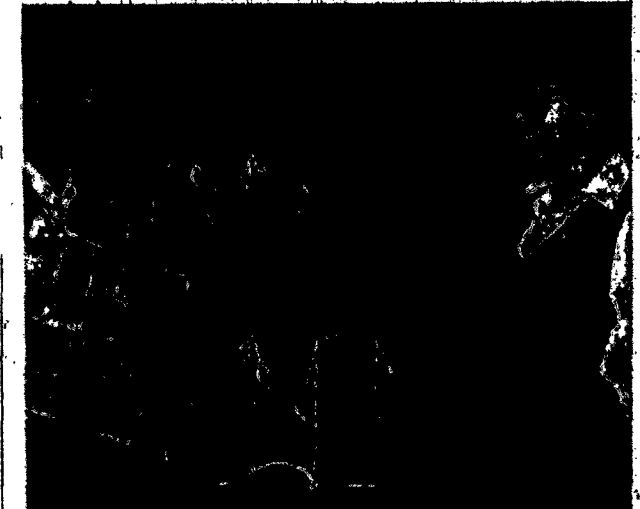
