

## Rome Scores Publishing Of Confidential Decree

Vatican City — (RNS) — Vatican circles here were reported greatly surprised at the publication in Paris of a message to France's Roman Catholic hierarchy from the Holy See which dissolved the worker-priest movement in that country.

They stressed the document was not intended "for the public." Its publication by Le Monde, an afternoon daily in Paris, also was reported to have upset the French bishops, who had looked at it as "strictly confidential."

It was indicated at the Vatican that the Holy See would have preferred to avoid publicity of the movement's dissolution.

The Vatican message had proposed that laymen, instructed by priests in Catholic social doctrine, continue the movement's work.

Signed by Giuseppe Cardinal Fiascaro, Secretary of the Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office, the message said that the Holy See considered factory work "incompatible with the priestly life and obligations."

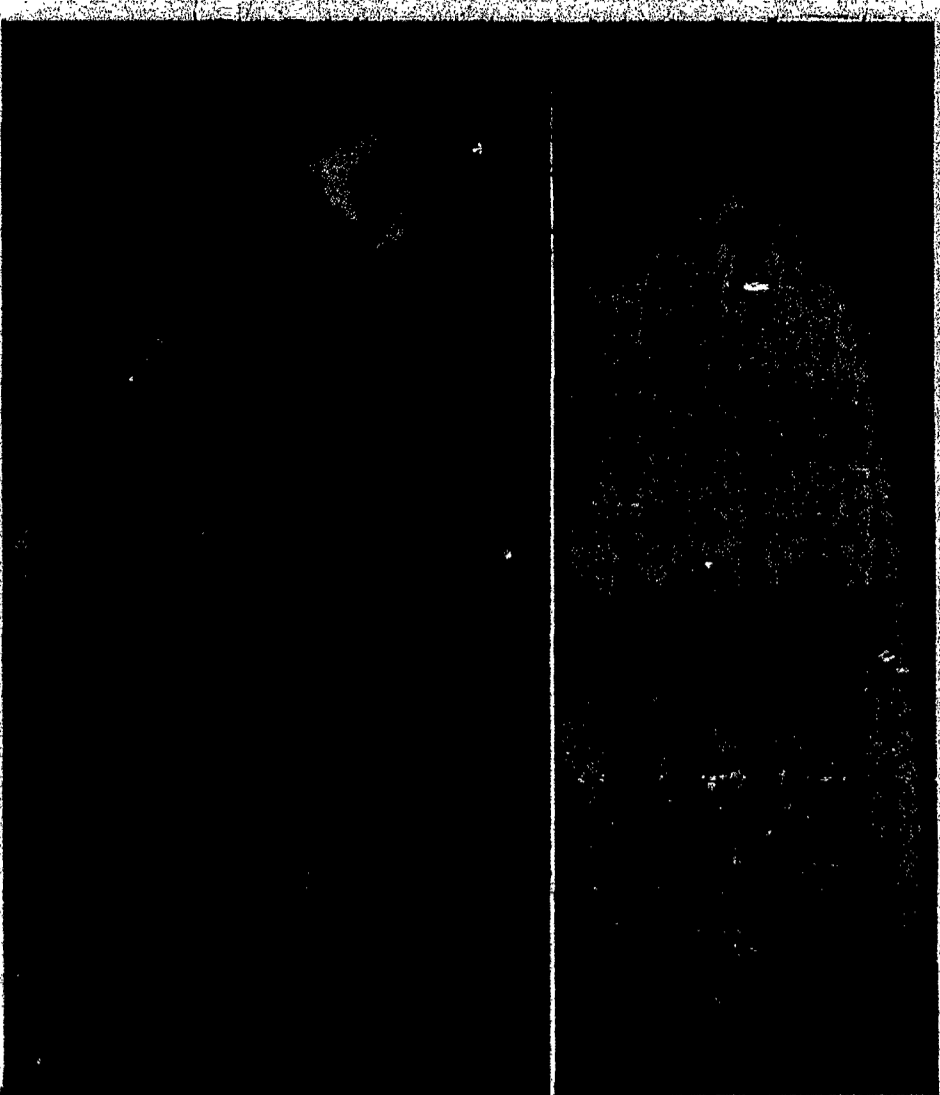

## Want Religion Classes

Cedar Rapids — (RNS) — More than three-fourths of 266 local school superintendents in Iowa believe that religion should be taught in public schools, if it is presented without a sectarian viewpoint, according to an educational research survey.

Only one superintendent in 12 thought the state's public schools should avoid religion completely.

THE SURVEY of religion in education was made by William T. Jochumson, an Iowa State Teachers College graduate student, for a master's degree in education.

In the opinion of 75 per cent of the queried school heads, the constitutional principle of Church-State separation does not rule out teaching about religion in public schools.

Teachers in 80 per cent of the schools are now permitted to talk about religion factually and objectively whenever religious questions come up. However, 75 per cent of the superintendents thought teachers lack the necessary preparation for such discussions.

### Commercialism Threat To Shrines

Montreal — (NC) — Commercialism threatens to convert "from haven of prayer and penance into mecca for tourists," according to the pilgrimage director of one famous Canadian shrine.

Father Henry Bernard, C.S.C., pilgrimage director at St. Joseph's Oratory, warned in a magazine article that "popular fancy, travel agents and even some well meaning pilgrimage promoters" are bringing the change about.

To offset such a threat to St. Joseph's Oratory, he added, authorities have taken such steps as banning improper attire, insisting on respectful behavior, disapproving undignified publicity and refusing cooperation to travel agencies which seek to exploit the shrine as a tourist attraction.

### Eucharist Behind Bars

Chicago — (NC) — A new chapel in the Cook County jail where the Blessed Sacrament will be continually exposed for adoration has been dedicated by Archbishop Albert G. Meyer of Chicago.

Archbishop Meyer explained that the chapel was established with the special permission of the Holy See.

Prisoners, dressed in black cassocks and surplices, made up the choir for the ceremony. The Archbishop blessed the inmates as he concluded the dedication and asked them to pray for him.

### More Technical Schools Needed

Versailles — (RNS) — Delegates to the 35th National Council of the Young Christian Workers (Jocist) Movement here urged that more technical colleges be established in France for the growing number of science-minded young men and women.

The Jocists pointed out that young workers attending apprenticeship centers or technical colleges were often obliged to leave home to study at the only available institutions in distant parts of the country.
