

Aquinas Downs Corning To Meet Fallon High

The Little Irish of Aquinas Institute got off to a winning start last Friday evening in Corning when they downed the Corning Free Academy squad by the narrow margin of 13-12.

It was Bob Mirquet, who scored the first touchdown for the Irish, in the new '39 season, after Corning had taken the lead 6-0.

Bob Cortese put the Maroon and White ahead for the first time with his conversion kick, 7-6.

PETE SHAUGHNESSY who averaged 84 yards per carry and had a total of 160 yards to his credit on the ground scored the second Irish touchdown after the Corning team had taken the lead for the second time 12-6.

This closed the scoring for the game as the Aquinas boys on held on to their narrow 13-12 lead and the first win of the 1939 season.

THIS SUNDAY at 2 p.m. in the Aquinas Memorial Stadium, the Little Irish will face the Flyers of Bishop Fallon High of Buffalo. Fallon won the inaugural contest between the two teams last year 19-13.

Fallon dropped their first ball game last Sunday to Bishop Ryan of Buffalo and will be seeking to pull up to a 500 average.

Aquinas will field Dennis Fox and Larry Clar at the ends; Mike Riley and Tony Elst at tackle; Joe Colemani and Jim Cincilli at guard; Jim Zdzinski at center; Bob Mirquet in the quarterback slot; Larry Hurley and Tom DiGesare at halfback; and Pete Shaughnessy in the fullback position.

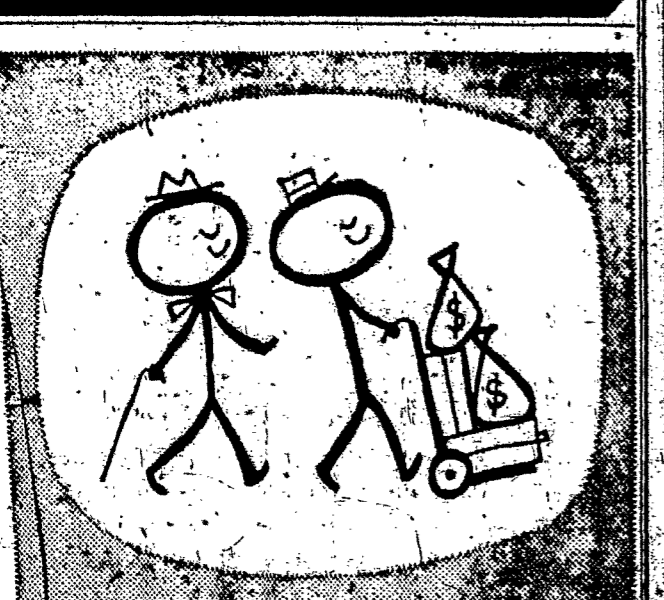

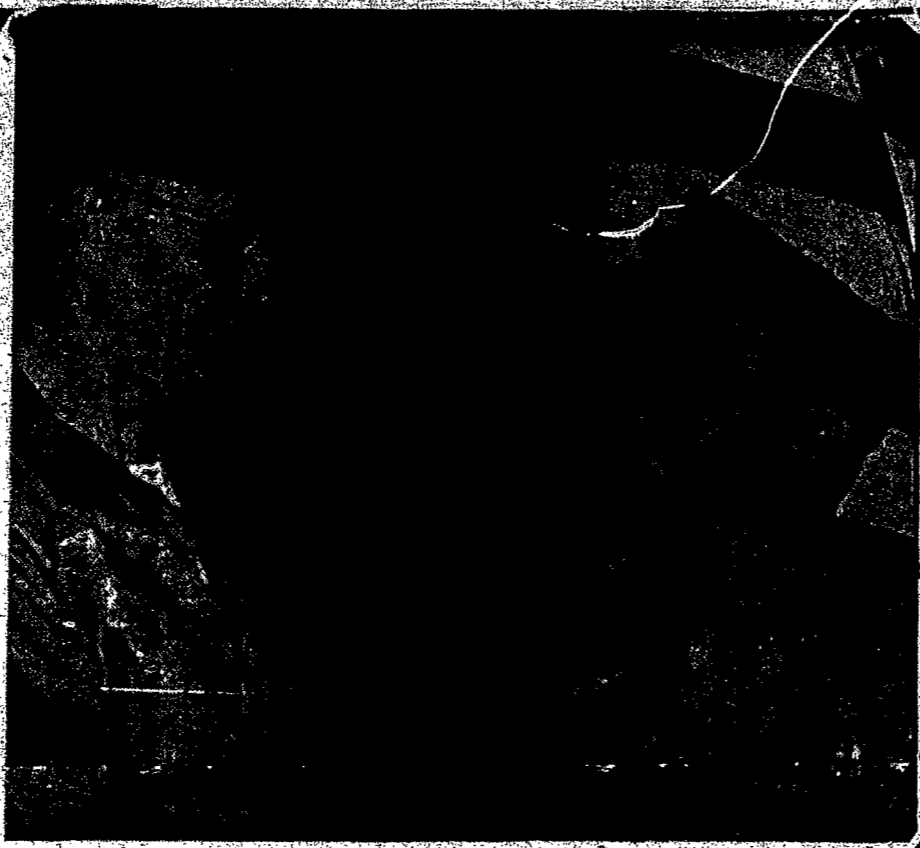
