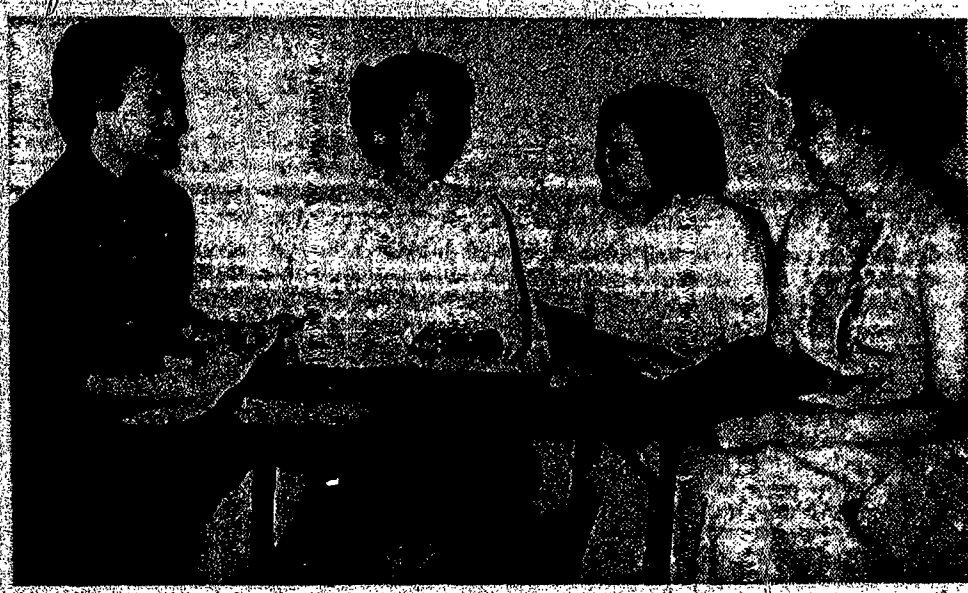
MRS. REAGAN died the previous Saturday at Corning Hospital where she had been a patient for two weeks.

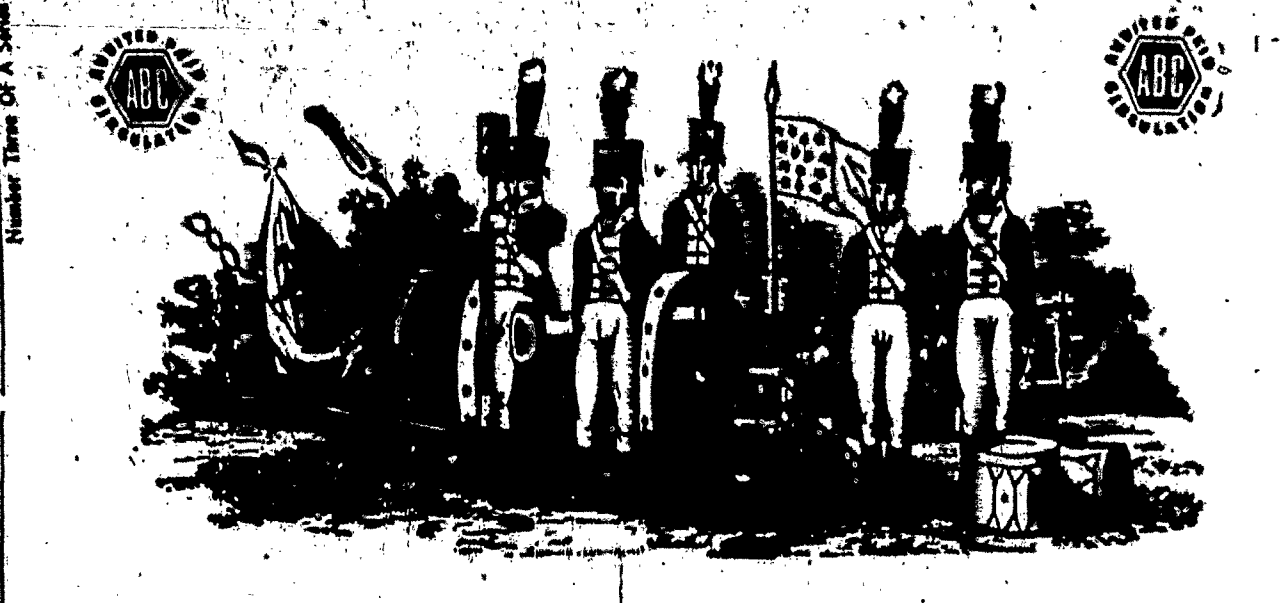
