

### 43 Enroll For Courses In Religion

Forty-three women enrolled in the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine Lay Teachers Course Monday evening. Courses for parishioners were: St. Ambrose, St. Ann's, St. Anthony's, Holy Rosary, St. Joseph's, St. Mary's, St. Michael's and St. Patrick's.

### Cardinal Scores Paris, Daily

Paris — (NC) — Maurice Cardinal Feltin of Paris has made a protest to Le Monde, influential Paris daily, for publishing the Holy See's confidential letter ordering the end of France's priest-writer experiment. It was Le Monde which first published the text of the Holy See's decision, which was in the form of a letter from Cardinal Pizzardi, secretary of the Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office, to Cardinal Feltin. There was no indication as to how Le Monde obtained the text of the letter.

### Science Seminar Program Set Up

Widespread interest is being shown in the Science Seminar program of the J.C. Berg Foundation for the Advancement of Science, which has been set up at Our Lady of Mercy High School as another step forward in providing special education for the technically gifted individual.

The 2 1/2 hour sessions are being held weekly at Our Lady of Mercy, are non-credit and extra-curricular. They offer the gifted students instruction in scientific concepts, methods and applications much more advanced, rigorous and individualized than is possible under the normal high school curriculum.

**THE FACULTY** of the seminar will be composed of outstanding scientists and educators from Rochester industries and institutions of higher education.

The program was offered to 30 top students in the 10th and 11th grades. From this group thirty seminar students from the five schools were selected on the basis of their school records, ability, science aptitude and the results of a 2 1/2 hour qualifying science examination given Sept. 17 at Mercy by Jacob W. Shapiro of Chicago, co-ordinator for the foundation.
