This Friday's schedule finds Cork (24) vs. Down (62); Meath (53) vs. Taras (35), and Clare (24) vs. Mayo (62).

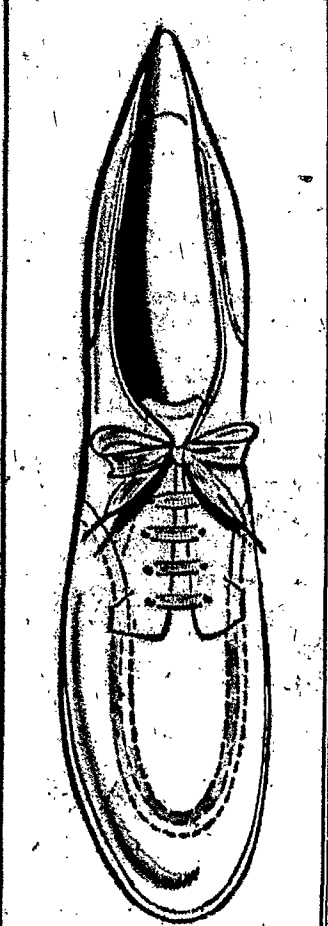
Adult Confirmation Slated For Area
