

Hard Of Hearing Priest To Give Retreat For Deaf

The Rev. John B. Valente, O.F.M., will conduct a retreat for the adult deaf of the diocese at St. Francis De Sales Chapel on Oct. 15, 16 and 17. Services will be held at 8 p.m. each evening and close with Mass and breakfast on Sunday, Oct. 18 at 9:15 a.m.

ALL THROUGH his seminary days, Father Valente had a progressive loss of hearing and from his first day in the priesthood he had to use a hearing aid. He was ordained in 1933 and did not go into deaf work until 1955 when his loss of hearing became so great that he took up the "Sign Language." His early priesthood found him in parishes in New York, Washington, and North Carolina.

In 1955 Father Valente took an "A. U. R. A. Rehabilitation Course" at Central Institute for the Deaf in St. Louis and was tutored in the sign language by Rev. Stephen Landherr, C.S.S.R. Since 1956 he has been stationed in Providence, R. I., devoting most of his time and talents to the deaf apostolate.

Anti-Red Program Told In National Magazine

The anti-Communist activities of DeSales High School, Geneva, are featured in an article appearing in the November issue of The Shield, national magazine of the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade.

The article reports a "May Day" program of prayer and sacrifice sponsored by the school's Anti-Communism Club. The day was an effort to counteract the Soviet show of military power always associated with the first day of May.

PRAYER activities, according to the magazine article, included Mass and Holy Communion, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, frequent visits and praying the Rosary. The Anti-Communist Club distributed mimeographed copies of special intentions for which each decade of the Rosary could be offered. They included: "strength for tortured and persecuted Christians" and "preservation of the Faith in Communist-held countries."

Sacrifice was in the form of silence between class periods. The Shield article explains that special intentions for which the silence was to be offered were announced over the public address system before each change of class.

Activities such as this one at DeSales High School are a part of the Anti-Communist program being carried on by CSMS units across the country. Although chiefly a program of study, it also aims at action within the scope of student limitations.



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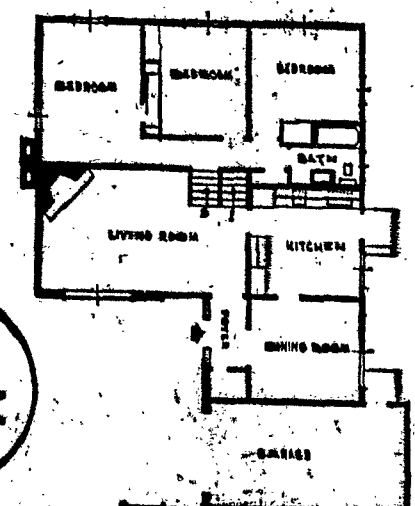
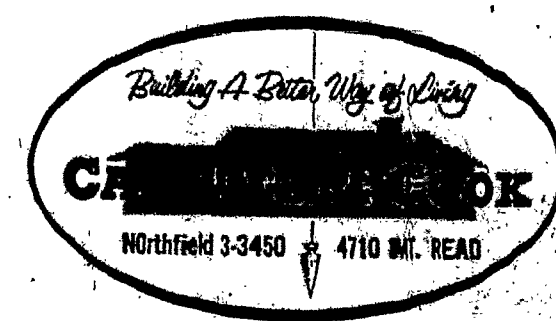
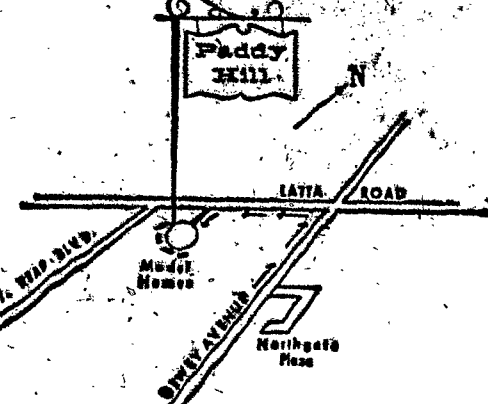
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
