Priest's Father Rites Saturday

Thomas Joseph Hogan, 68, of 25 Chantrelle St. and father of the Rev. Daniel V. Hogan, assistant pastor of St. Michael's Church, Rochester, died Wednesday, Oct. 7, 1939.

Requiem Mass will be celebrated Saturday, Oct. 10 at 9 a.m. in Corpus Christi Church. Mr. Hogan married as a Rochester fireman in 1932 after 21 years service.

Mr. Hogan was a member of the Holy Name Society of Corpus Christi Church and of the Belvedere Firemen's Benevolent Association.

Born in Cobourg, Ontario, Can., he moved to this country 49 years ago. As a fireman he was assigned in 1921 to the fire house at Dewey Avenue and Bryan Street.

Besides his eldest son, he is survived by his wife Mary, another son, Edward F. Hogan, a daughter, Marie Eleanor Hogan, two brothers, James P. of Richmond, Va., and Robert E. Hogan of Cobourg, and two grandchildren.

Prayer services will be conducted at 9:30 a.m. Saturday in the John J. McLaughlin Funeral Home, 67 E. Culver Road. Burial will be in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.
