**Fund Aids Hospital, Family Center**

The United Fund of Cayuga County contributed \$25,878 to aid Mercy Hospital and the Catholic Family Center during 1958, the two agencies announced this week.

Both agencies provided services totalling \$715,827 to the aged, sick and needy of the Auburn area during the past year.

A month long campaign was launched Tuesday evening to raise funds for a total of 20 social agencies in Auburn and Cayuga County.

Bishop Keane, in a letter to Catholics of the Auburn area urged "generous support" of the United Fund campaign.

He said, "The success of this Drive depends on the willingness of everyone to make some sacrifice for the benefit of the many deserving agencies for which the appeal is made."

Monsignor John S. Randall, at the kick-off dinner Tuesday evening, told campaign workers they should make their door-to-door calls by dedicating their time as "Christian charity" to aid "the infirm, the orphan, the retarded child, the helpless paralytic."

THE CENTER found homes for 22 children either through adoption or foster care and guided 30 couples in solving marriage problems. Other services included personal counseling, care for unwed mothers, and parent-child guidance.

A BREAKDOWN of the services given by Mercy Hospital and the Catholic Family Center showed 4,924 persons aided by the two Catholic Auburn agencies.

Mercy Hospital is staffed by 14 Franciscan nuns under the direction of Sister Joan Alice, administrator, and Sister Amalia, superior and directress of nurses.

The Catholic Family Center executive secretary is Robert G. McAvoy and staff assistant is Catherine Burns.

**Reds Close Shanghai Seminary**

Hoag Kung — (RNS) — The Catholic Zi Ki Wei seminary in Shanghai has been converted by Chinese Communist authorities into a headquarters for a "people's committee," according to information received here.

Previously, the more than 100-year-old seminary had been used as a Communist indoctrination center for youth and an exhibition hall for the "Catholic Patriotic Association," a government-backed schismatic group.

The seminary was originally confiscated by the Communists in September, 1955, following the arrest of Bishop Ignatius Kung of Shanghai.

Catholic sources here interpreted the new Red move as indicating that the Communists have given up their idea of recruiting a Party-serving clergy in the Shanghai diocese.
