

Rome Studies Zone Bishops

Rome — (NC) — A plan to divide Rome into zones to be administered by various auxiliary bishops is expected to be discussed at the forthcoming Rome synod.

Competent sources connected with the preparation of the synod said the zoning of Rome into ecclesiastical jurisdictions would aim at better administration of various groups and classes.

The zones, according to the source, would be laid out to include a majority of one or another level of income.

The idea would be that each zone could deal more adequately with the problems of its faithful and that zones with similar income levels in various parts of the city would be able to exchange ideas and pastoral experiences.

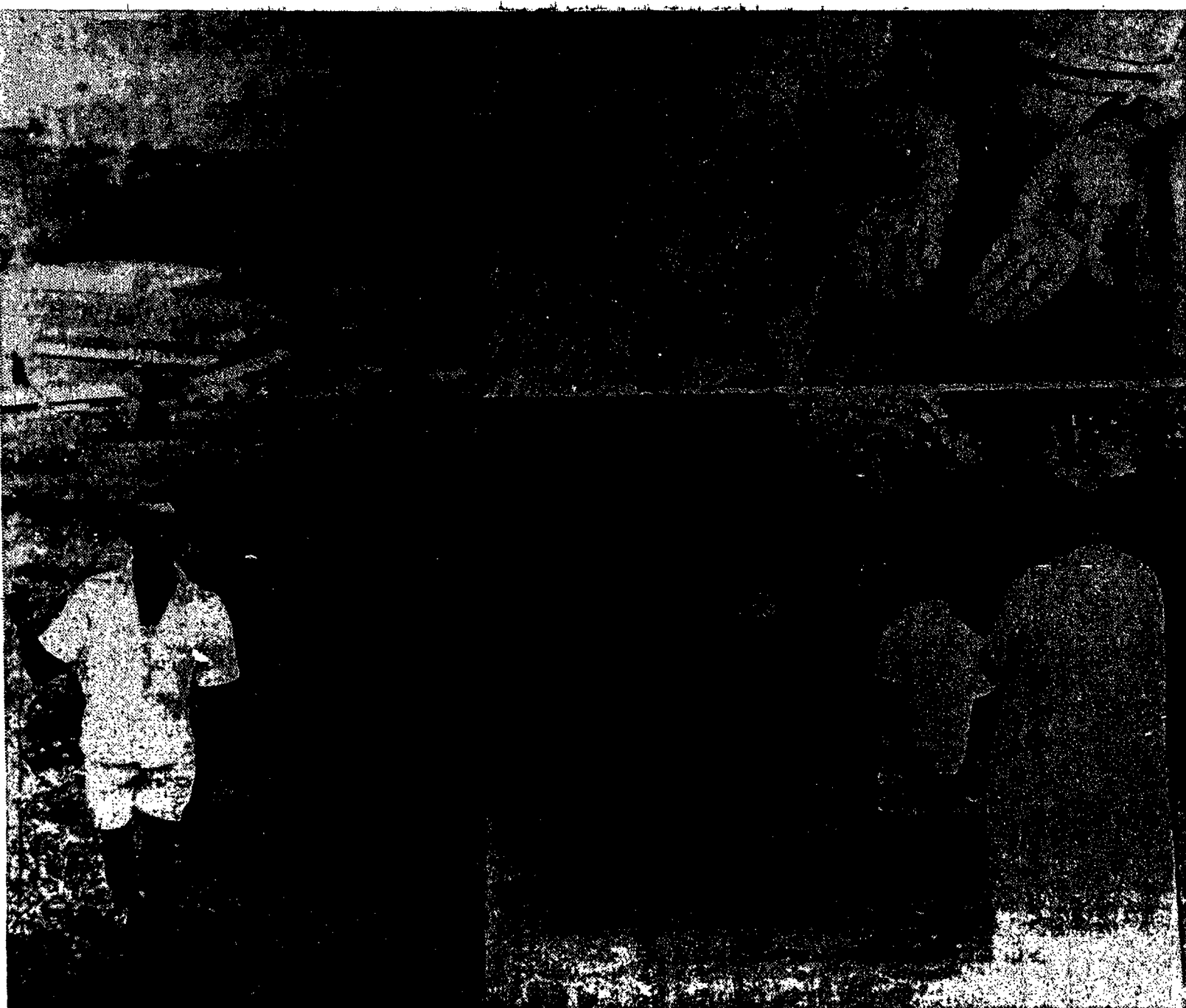

Italy Nuns Rival Angels

Turin — (RNS) — Two Italian nuns were given pilots' licenses after passing rigorous tests here.

Sister Marie Cleofe and Sister Maria Innocenza, both trained teachers as well as nurses, became the first Italian nuns in history to be licensed to fly planes.

The nuns completed an intensive four-months' course at the Aviazione Missionaria, an institute set up some years ago to train missionaries in the use of planes, in preparation for assignments in mission areas in Asia.



Native Claims Miracle In Africa

Uganda, British East Africa — (RNS) — Photos from Africa's "Drum" Magazine present the story of Lazarus Byekwaso, formerly a cripple for 24 years, who attributes his miraculous cure to prayer before a statue of Our Lady of Fatima.

At the left he is seen walking up a hill near the Uganda mission operated by the White Fathers. At the upper right his hands, previously calloused and

deformed from years of walking on them, are compared with those of a teacher.

The bottom photo shows Lazarus and a White Father viewing the spot where the statue of the Virgin stood during a three-day stay in the parish.

Lazarus, who reported he was cured three days after praying before the image, says, "I owe it to the merciful goodness of Mary."

Rome Marks Anniversary OF Pius XII

Vatican City — (RNS) — Two American cardinals were among 24 Princes of the Church who joined Pope John XXIII at solemn memorial rites in St. Peter's Basilica on the first anniversary of the death of Pope Pius XII.

A hushed congregation that included the Vatican diplomatic corps saw Pope John walk in solemn silence the entire length of the great basilica to the altar where Benedetto Cardinal Aloisi Masella, Archbishop of the Lateran Basilica and Camerlengo of the Holy Roman Church, offered a Mass for the dead Pontiff, with the Sistine Choir assisting.

Sitting with the other members of the Sacred College were Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, and John Cardinal O'Hara, Archbishop of Philadelphia, who had come to Rome for celebrations marking the 100th anniversary of the Pontifical North American College.

The altar of the cathedral choir was draped in black, and the Pope was in red, the papal color of mourning. The memorial service was said to have been the first of its kind held in the ancient church.

Cardinal Spellman had earlier offered a Mass for the soul of Pius XII before his flower-decked tomb in the grotto of the basilica. Throughout the Catholic world thousands of other Masses were offered for the Pontiff whose reign of 19 years was regarded as one of the most memorable in the 2,000-year history of the papacy.

Monks Plan Junior College

Cleveland — (RNS) — Benedictines of St. Andrew's Abbey are considering the establishment of a two-year junior college here as an extension of Berea College High School. The junior college would be the first in this area which has five colleges accepting males but no junior college.

Abbot Theodore Kolis, O.S.B., said the junior college idea has been under discussion for about one year.

New School On Formosa

Mobile Chapels Serve Refugees

Koenigsstein-Tanus — (RNS) — Twenty mobile chapels operated by the Dutch-Belgian Aid for Eastern Priests organization returned to their winter quarters here after serving some 300,000 Catholic refugees and displaced persons in West Germany and other West European countries this year.

Missionaries accompanying the chapels included over 100 priests and religious from many countries. The priests preached sermons, gave Communion and heard confessions.

Canada's Mayflower

Montreal — (RNS) — More than 3,000 persons flocked into St. Joseph's Oratory here for an occasion that was both an anniversary Mass and one of the biggest family reunions on record.

All were descendants of the 107 persons who, 300 years ago, boarded the *Salut Andre* at La Rochelle, France, and sailed for Montreal in a voyage which means as much to Canadians as the voyage of the *Mayflower* signifies for Americans.

There are an estimated 50,000 of these descendants all told, but only 3,000 could be here for the celebration, which coincided with others in the continent.
