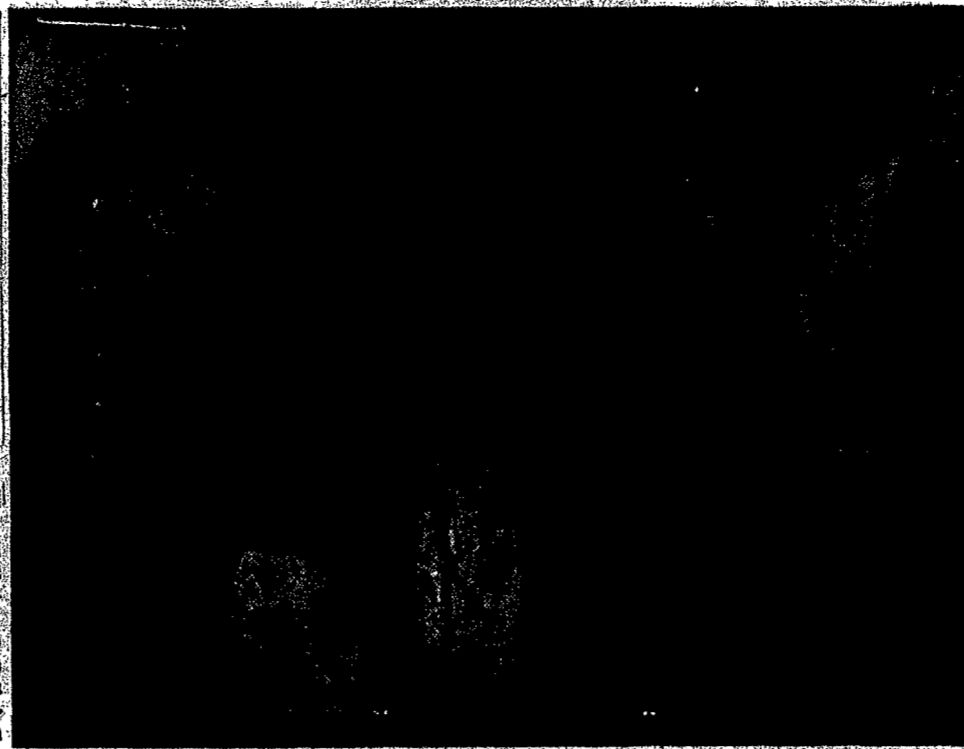

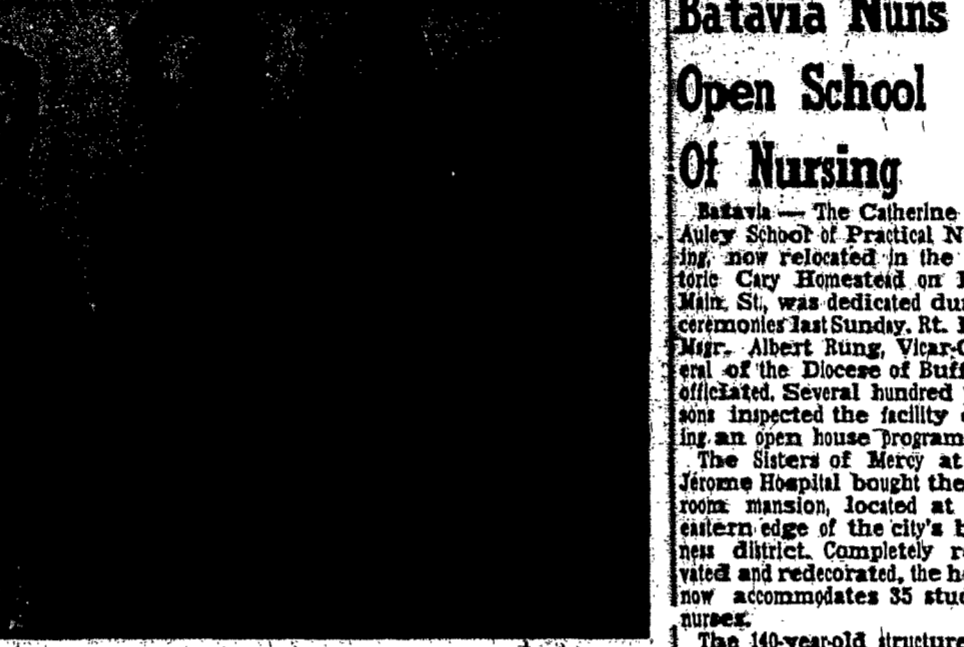

Judge Asserts Authority Lack Due To Parents

Bath — St. Mary's Rosary and Altar Society met at the Moonlight Restaurant in Bath, N.Y., on Wednesday, Oct. 7 at 8 p.m. with approximately 100 members in attendance.

GUEST SPEAKER of the evening was Steuben County Judge Demetrius L. Gabrielli. Judge Gabrielli spoke on his experiences in the Children's Court and emphasized that delinquency is caused basically by the lack of respect for authority. He pointed out that the respect for authority should first be taught in the home and the lack of parental guidance and broken homes are major factors in this respect.

He called for a higher sense of "moral and religious values" to be instilled in the youth because they are the cornerstones of any society.

JUDGE GABRIELLI also explained the workings of the new proposed family court and related that with this new court the problems of the entire family would be handled in one court in the new structure there would be greater control over the parents, and the judge related that in most cases they are the ones who are responsible for the juvenile problems.

Batavia Nuns Open School Of Nursing

Batavia — The Catherine McAuley School of Practical Nursing, now relocated in the historic Cary Homestead on East Main St., was dedicated during ceremonies last Sunday, Rt. Rev. Msgr. Albert Bunge, Vicar General of the Diocese of Buffalo, officiated. Several hundred persons inspected the facility during an open house program.

The Sisters of Mercy at St. Jerome Hospital bought the 24-room mansion, located at the eastern edge of the city's business district. Completely renovated and redecorated, the home now accommodates 35 student nurses.

The 140-year-old structure, in the Cary family for six generations, now houses two lecture rooms, a demonstration room, nutritional lab, library, lounge and faculty office. Most of the students are from Western New York.

Assisting in the ceremonies were Reverend Mother Mary Vincent, head of the Sisters of Mercy in the Buffalo Diocese, Very Rev. Msgr. William C. Kirby of Batavia and Rev. Joseph Prima, hospital chaplain. The program was arranged by the St. Jerome Advisory Board. Students under the direction of Sister Mary Daniel, school director, escorted guests through the building.
