

Catholics Back Nehru In India

Vienna — (RNS) — Valerian Cardinal Gracias, Archbishop of Bombay, declared here that India's five and one-half million Roman Catholics fully support the Nehru government because of the complete freedom of religion guaranteed by the Indian federal constitution.

The prelate spoke at a luncheon in his honor given by Franz Cardinal Koenig, Archbishop of Vienna, and attended by numerous high church and government leaders.

Existing good Church-State relations in his country, the visiting cardinal said, are the result of the Constitution being "fully implemented in every state."

He pointed out that the Indian government not only permits denominational schools, but actually encourages them by offering subsidies to educational institutions which meet standards set by the state.

"There are many Catholic schools and colleges which are receiving such grants," he noted. "But Catholic schools are really public, in the sense that many non-Catholics and even non-Christians attend, due to the high scholastic rating of such institutions."

Massive Reluctance

Jesuit Scores Catholic Apathy

Washington — (NC) — The late Pope Pius XII was an unabashed internationalist who "very firmly committed the Holy See to the support of the basic principles behind the movement for world federalism."

However, Father Robert F. Drinan, S.J., declared in his keynote address at the 32nd annual meeting of the Catholic Association for International Peace, "the Catholic community in America has by instinct and tradition never been fully in total sympathy with the world federalism advocated by the late Holy Father."

Father Drinan, dean of the Boston College school of law, in the course of his pontificate, said: "It is indeed a tragedy that the Church in the United States, blessed with remarkable states, has failed in a notable way even to know, much less to radiate, the principles of international brotherhood so brilliantly expounded by the Pope by Pius XII."

The late Pope's support of world federalism was based on not because they will thereby follow the tradition of the law of nations which enriches the pages of Aquinas, Suarez and all the moral theologians of the Church," Father Drinan said.

The speaker complained of the fact that American Catholics "seem to manifest a massive reluctance to endorse any form of internationalism which requires the greatest surrender of American sovereignty," he said.

Following the organization of the United Nations, Father Drinan said, Pope Pius "repeatedly urged" Catholics to give it their "fullest cooperation," though recognizing at the same time that some of its concessions to national sovereignty weakened its effectiveness.

150,000 Pilgrims At Fatima

Fatima — (RNS) — An estimated 150,000 pilgrims gathered here to commemorate the 42nd anniversary of the final apparition of Our Lady of Fatima to the three shepherd children in 1917. The first of the apparitions took place on May 13 that year.

The ceremonies, lasting two days, were highlighted by candlelight processions culminating in Solemn Masses on the steps outside the Fatima Basilica. The Masses were offered outside because of the impossibility of accommodating all the pilgrims inside.
