Bishop Kearney's Birthday To Highlight DCCW Meet

A birthday celebration in honor of Bishop Kearney will highlight the 25th annual convention of the Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women to be held in the Chamber of Commerce on Tuesday, Oct. 27.

Almost 600 women from affiliated parish and national organizations throughout the diocese are expected to attend the 9:30 a.m. Dialogue Mass to be celebrated by Bishop Kearney in Saint Mary's Church, South St., according to Mrs. Lawrence P. Weis, convention chairman, and Mrs. Cyril H. Barker, co-chairman.

Welcoming address to the representatives of 60,000 Catholic women in the diocese will be given after the Mass by Bishop Kearney, episcopal chairman.

THE PROGRAM at the Chamber of Commerce will begin with a panel discussion, entitled "To know Christ, To Love Him, To Serve Him," from 11:00 a.m. until 12 noon.

Seminarians Serve As Catechism Teachers

One hundred fifteen hours a week are devoted to the teaching of catechetics by seminarians of St. Bernard's Seminary, it was reported this week by the Rev. Albert H. Schnack, diocesan director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine.

The seminarians, in average groups of four, teach catechism under the relaxed time program in 26 parishes and institutions of the Rochester area. For each young man, this weekly activity is performed in addition to his heavy seminary schedule of studies.

A RATHER NOVEL assignment has been given to 12 of the St. Bernard's men at the Rochester School for the Deaf. There, under the tutelage of the Rev. John B. Gallagher, C.S.S.R., they have learned the manual alphabet of the deaf and sign language in order that they might instruct the deaf.

Other parishes served by the seminarians include: Annunciation, Blessed Sacrament, Corpus Christi, Holy Apostles, Holy Cross, Holy Family, Holy Redeemer, Mount Carmel, Perpetual Help, Mother of Sorrows, St. Ambrose, St. Andrew, St. Anthony, St. Charles, St. Francis Assisi, St. John (Greece), St. Michael, St. Monica, St. Patrick,
